A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to health benefits offered by institutions of higher
3	education to students and their families.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 1275.002, Insurance Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	Sec. 1275.002. APPLICABILITY OF CHAPTER. This chapter
8	applies to a health benefit plan offered by:
9	(1) a nonprofit agricultural organization under
10	Chapter 1682; and
11	(2) an institution of higher education under Chapter
12	<u>1683</u> .
13	SECTION 2. Subtitle K, Title 8, Insurance Code, is amended
14	by adding Chapter 1683 to read as follows:
15	CHAPTER 1683. HEALTH BENEFITS PROVIDED BY CERTAIN INSTITUTIONS OF
16	HIGHER EDUCATION
17	Sec. 1683.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
18	(1) "Institution of higher education" means:
19	(A) an institution of higher education, as
20	defined by Section 61.003, Education Code; or
21	(B) a private or independent institution of
22	higher education, as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code.
23	(2) "Higher education health benefits" means health

24 benefits:

1	(A) sponsored by an institution of higher
2	education or an affiliate of the institution;
3	(B) offered only to:
4	(i) students enrolled at the institution of
5	higher education; and
6	(ii) family members of students enrolled at
7	the institution of higher education;
8	(C) that are not provided through an insurance
9	policy or other product the offering or issuance of which is
10	regulated as the business of insurance in this state; and
11	(D) that are deemed by the institution of higher
12	education to be important in assisting its students and their
13	families to live long and productive lives.
14	(3) "Preexisting condition" means a condition present
15	before the effective date of an individual's enrollment in higher
16	education health benefits.
17	Sec. 1683.002. HIGHER EDUCATION HEALTH BENEFITS
18	AUTHORIZED. An institution of higher education or an affiliate of
19	the institution may offer in this state higher education health
20	benefits.
21	Sec. 1683.003. WAITING PERIOD FOR PREEXISTING CONDITION.
22	Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, an institution
23	of higher education that offers higher education health benefits
24	may not require a waiting period of more than six months for
25	treatment of a preexisting condition otherwise included in higher
26	education health benefits.
27	Sec 1683 NO/ PROTITED DISCLOSURE FOR HIGHER EDUCATION

- 1 HEALTH BENEFITS. (a) An institution of higher education that
- 2 offers higher education health benefits must provide to an
- 3 individual applying for higher education health benefits written
- 4 notice that the benefits are not provided through an insurance
- 5 policy or other product the offering or issuance of which is
- 6 regulated as the business of insurance in this state.
- 7 (b) An individual must sign and return to the institution of
- 8 higher education the notice described by Subsection (a) before the
- 9 individual may enroll in higher education health benefits. The
- 10 <u>institution of higher education must:</u>
- 11 (1) maintain a copy of the signed written notice for
- 12 the duration of the term during which the higher education health
- 13 benefits are provided to the individual; and
- 14 (2) at the request of the individual, provide a copy of
- 15 the written notice to the individual.
- 16 Sec. 1683.005. INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION NOT ENGAGED
- 17 IN BUSINESS OF HEALTH INSURANCE. Notwithstanding any other
- 18 provision of this code, for the purposes of offering higher
- 19 education health benefits, an institution of higher education that
- 20 acts in accordance with this chapter is not a health insurer and is
- 21 not engaging in the business of health insurance in this state.
- Sec. 1683.006. RISK TRANSFER OR COVERAGE. An institution
- 23 of higher education that offers higher education health benefits
- 24 under this chapter may contract with a company authorized to engage
- 25 in the business of insurance in this state that is not under common
- 26 control with the institution of higher education to:
- 27 (1) transfer to that company all or a portion of the

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- 1 organization's risks arising from higher education health benefits
- 2 offered under this chapter; or
- 3 (2) obtain insurance coverage from the company
- 4 guarantying the institution of higher education's obligations
- 5 arising from higher education health benefits offered under this
- 6 chapter.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
