H.B. No. 3376

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to psychological and physical examinations required to obtain a license issued by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 1701.306, Occupations Code, is amended 5 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 1701.306. PSYCHOLOGICAL AND PHYSICAL EXAMINATION. (a) 7 In this section: 8 (1) "Mental health professional" means a: 9 (A) psychologist licensed under Chapter 501; 10 11 (B) psychiatrist licensed under Subtitle B, 12 Title 3; or (C) person licensed under Subtitle I, Title 3, 13 other than a person described by Paragraph (A), who holds a doctoral 14 degree from an accredited institution of higher education in the 15 16 field in which the person is licensed. (2) "Physician" means a person licensed under Subtitle 17 B, Title 3. 18 (a-1) The commission may not issue a license to a person 19 unless the person is examined by: 20 21 (1) a mental health professional [licensed psychologist or by a psychiatrist] who declares in writing that the 22 23 person is in satisfactory psychological and emotional health to serve as the type of officer for which a license is sought; and 24

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1 (2) a [licensed] physician who declares in writing 2 that the person does not show any trace of drug dependency or 3 illegal drug use after a blood test or other medical test.

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4 An agency hiring a person for whom a license is sought (b) 5 shall select the examining physician and the examining mental health professional [psychologist or psychiatrist]. The agency 6 shall prepare a report of each declaration required by Subsection 7 (a-1) [(a)] and shall maintain a copy of the report on file in a 8 format readily accessible to the commission. A declaration is not 9 public information. 10

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(c) The commission shall adopt rules that:

(1) relate to appropriate standards and measures to be used by a law enforcement agency in reporting the declarations made under Subsection <u>(a-1)</u> [(a)]; and

(2) provide for exceptional circumstances in the administration of the examination of the applicant's psychological and emotional health, including permitting the examination to be made by a qualified [licensed] physician instead of a mental health professional [psychologist or psychiatrist].

(d) The commission may order an applicant to submit to an
examination described by Subsection <u>(a-1)</u> [(a)] by a <u>mental health</u>
<u>professional</u> [psychologist, psychiatrist,] or physician appointed
by the commission if the commission:

(1) has cause to believe that a law enforcement agency
 failed to follow commission rules relating to an examination; or
 (2) discovers that the applicant has submitted a false

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SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act to Section 1 1701.306, Occupations Code, apply to a license for which an 2 application is filed under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, on or 3 4 after the effective date of this Act. An application for a license filed under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, before the effective 5 6 date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the application was filed, and the former law is continued in effect for 7 8 that purpose.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
