A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the regulation of veterinary chiropractic.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 801.151(c), Occupations Code, is amended
5	to read as follows:
6	(c) The board shall adopt rules to:
7	(1) protect the public;
8	(2) ensure that alternate therapies, including
9	ultrasound diagnosis and therapy, magnetic field therapy, holistic
10	medicine, homeopathy, [chiropractic treatment,] acupuncture, and
11	laser therapy, are performed only by a veterinarian or under the
12	supervision of a veterinarian;
13	(3) ensure that equine dentistry is performed only by
14	a veterinarian who is active and in good standing or by a licensed
15	equine dental provider who is active and in good standing under the
16	appropriate level of supervision of a veterinarian who is active
17	and in good standing and who has established a
18	veterinarian-client-patient relationship with the owner or other
19	caretaker of an animal in accordance with Section 801.351; [and]
20	(4) ensure that chiropractic treatment and
21	musculoskeletal manipulation are performed only by:
22	(A) a veterinarian who is active and in good
23	standing; or
24	(B) a chiropractor licensed in good standing

- 2 <u>(i) certified in good standing by the</u>
- 3 American Veterinary Chiropractic Association; or
- 4 <u>(ii) acting under the supervision of a</u>
- 5 <u>veterinarian; and</u>
- $\underline{\text{(5)}}$ provide for the licensing and regulation of
- 7 licensed veterinary technicians.
- 8 SECTION 2. Not later than June 1, 2024, the State Board of
- 9 Veterinary Medical Examiners shall adopt rules necessary to
- 10 implement Section 801.151(c), Occupations Code, as amended by this
- 11 Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
