| 4 | SECTION 1. Section 85.0011, Local Government Code, is |

| 6 | Sec. 85.0011. QUALIFICATIONS FOR SHERIFF OR CANDIDATE FOR |

| 8 | (1) "Active duty" means current full-time military |
| 9 | service in the armed forces of the United States. |
| 10 | (2) "Armed forces of the United States" means the |
| 11 | army, navy, air force, space force, coast guard, or marine corps of |
| 12 | the United States or a reserve unit of one of those branches of the |

- 15 described by Section 2.122, Code of Criminal Procedure.
- 16 (4) "Military veteran" means a person who has served
- on active duty and who was discharged or released from active duty.

- 20 <u>(b)</u> A person is not eligible to serve as sheriff unless the
- 21 person:
- 22 (1) has a high school diploma or a high school

- 24 (2) holds an active permanent peace officer

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- 1 license [is eligible to be licensed] under Chapter 1701 [Sections
- 2 1701.309 and 1701.312], Occupations Code;
- 3 (3) has a minimum of:
- 4 (A) 5 years experience as a full-time, paid peace
- 5 <u>officer or federal special investigator; or</u>
- 6 (B) 10 years combined active duty or national
- 7 guard service experience, and is a military veteran; and
- 8 (4) holds an intermediate, advanced, or master
- 9 proficiency certificate under Section 1701.402, Occupations Code.
- 10 (c) A person is not eligible to be a candidate for the office
- 11 of sheriff unless the person meets the qualifications prescribed by
- 12 <u>Subsection</u> (b).
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 1701.302(a), Occupations Code, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 (a) Except as provided by Section 85.0011, Local Government
- 16 Code, an [An] officer[, including a sheriff,] elected under the
- 17 Texas Constitution or a statute or appointed to fill a vacancy in an
- 18 elective office must obtain a license from the commission not later
- 19 than the second anniversary of the date the officer takes office.
- 20 SECTION 3. Section 85.0025, Local Government Code, is
- 21 repealed.
- 22 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act to Sections
- 23 85.0011 and 85.0025, Local Government Code, do not apply to a
- 24 sheriff serving a term that began before the effective date of this
- 25 Act. A sheriff serving a term that began before the effective date
- 26 of this Act is governed for the remainder of that term by Sections
- 27 85.0011 and 85.0025, Local Government Code, as those laws existed

- 3 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
