4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 370, Local Government Code, is amended
6	by adding Section 370.007 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 370.007. PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT FOR OVERDOSE
8	MAPPING. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Controlled substance" has the meaning assigned by
10	Section 481.002, Health and Safety Code.
11	(2) "Opioid antagonist" has the meaning assigned by
12	Section 483.101, Health and Safety Code.
13	(b) A local health authority or a law enforcement agency
14	located in a county with a population of more than 2 million may
15	enter into a participation agreement with an entity that maintains
16	a computerized system for mapping overdoses for public safety
17	purposes.
18	(c) A local health authority or law enforcement agency that
19	has entered into a participation agreement under Subsection (b)
20	shall:
21	(1) solicit and accept information regarding
22	overdoses occurring in the county; and
23	(2) provide information described by Subdivision (1)
24	to the entity with which the authority or agency has a participation

1	agreement under Subsection (b) for purposes of entering the
2	information into the computerized system.
3	(d) The following information regarding an overdose
4	incident, if known, must be entered into the computerized system:
5	(1) the date and time of the overdose incident;
6	(2) the GPS coordinates or approximate location of the
7	overdose incident;
8	(3) the suspected controlled substance involved in the
9	<u>overdose incident;</u>
10	(4) whether an opioid antagonist was administered and,
11	if so, the number of doses and type of delivery;
12	(5) whether the person who overdosed was transported
13	to the hospital;
14	(6) whether the overdose involved the operation of a
15	motor vehicle;
16	(7) whether multiple persons were involved in the
17	<u>overdose incident;</u>
18	(8) the sex and approximate age of each person
19	receiving treatment for an overdose; and
20	(9) whether the overdose was fatal or nonfatal.
21	(e) A person who provides information about an overdose
22	incident to a local health authority or law enforcement agency in
23	good faith under this section is not subject to civil or criminal
24	liability for providing the information.
25	(f) A law enforcement agency may use information provided or
26	received under this section only for mapping overdose locations for
27	public safety purposes.

(g) Information provided for purposes of overdose mapping 1 under this section is confidential and not subject to disclosure 2 under Chapter 552, Government Code. 3 4 (h) Section 181.154, Health and Safety Code, does not apply to information provided, received, or used under this section. 5 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 9

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10 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
