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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-19 relating to the establishment of an advisory committee to study 1-20 suicide prevention and peer support programs in fire departments in 1-21 this state.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act: (1) "Commission" means the Texas Commission on Fire (1) 1-24 1-25 Protection.

1-26 (2)"Fire department" has the meaning assigned by 1-27 Section 419.021, Government Code. (3) "Fire fighter" has the meaning assigned by Section

1-28 1-29 143.003, Local Government Code.

1-30 SECTION 2. ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (a) The commission shall 1-31 establish an advisory committee to study the need to implement suicide prevention and peer support programs in fire departments in 1-32 this state. The committee is composed of the following members: 1-33

two fire fighters, appointed by the Texas State 1-34 (1)Association of Firefighters; 1-35

1-36 (2) two fire fighters, appointed by the State Firefighters' and Fire Marshals' Association of Texas; (3) two fire chiefs, appointed by the Texas Fire 1-37

1-40 (4) one person who is licensed to provide professional 1-41 mental health services, as defined by Section 531.002, Health and Safety Code, appointed by the Texas Fire Chiefs Association; 1-42

1-43 (5) one person who is licensed to provide professional 1-44 mental health services as defined by Section 531.002, Health and 1-45 Code, Safety appointed by the Texas State Association of 1-46 Firefighters;

(6) one person who is licensed to provide professional mental health services, as defined by Section 531.002, Health and Safety Code, appointed by the State Firefighters' and Fire 1-47 1-48 1-49 1-50 Marshals' Association of Texas;

1-51 (7) one person, appointed by the executive director of 1-52 the Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service; and 1-53

(8) the executive director of the commission.
