4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 773, Health and Safety
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 773.0125 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 773.0125. PERSONAL ASSISTIVE MOBILITY DEVICE
8	PROTECTIONS. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Hospital" means a general hospital, a pediatric
10	and adolescent hospital, or a special hospital, as those terms are
11	defined by Section 241.003.
12	(2) "Personal assistive mobility device" means a
13	wheelchair or a motorized assistive mobility device, including a
14	motorized wheelchair.
15	(b) This section applies to the transport, custody, and
16	control of a personal assistive mobility device of a patient who is
17	receiving emergency medical services while the device is:
18	(1) in an emergency medical services vehicle;
19	(2) being transported or controlled by emergency
20	medical services personnel, including volunteers;
21	(3) being transported or controlled by an emergency
22	medical services provider;
23	(4) under the custody or control of a hospital; or
24	(5) under the custody or control of an individual who

1	is providing the emergency medical services for an emergency
2	medical services and trauma care system.
3	(c) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules to:
4	(1) ensure the safety and security of and the
5	protection of property rights in a patient's personal assistive
6	mobility device while the patient is receiving emergency medical
7	services as described by Subsection (b); and
8	(2) require each person or entity that provides the
9	emergency medical services to adopt procedures, in accordance with
10	commission rules, for the:
11	(A) safe and secure storage of the patient's
12	personal assistive mobility device for the duration of the service
13	provision;
14	(B) return to the patient of the patient's
15	personal assistive mobility device at the time the service
16	provision concludes; and
17	(C) safe and secure transfer of the patient's
18	personal assistive mobility device from one person providing
19	emergency medical services as described by Subsection (b) to
20	another person providing those services, including the transfer of
21	a personal assistive mobility device for a patient who is
22	transported by air.
23	SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
24	of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
25	Services Commission shall adopt the rules required by Section

26 773.0125, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.

27 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
