5	SECTION 1. Section 29.054, Education Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
7	(e) Notwithstanding Section 29.066(c), the agency may
8	require, for purposes of implementing Section 48.105, a school
9	district that is granted an exception under this section to:
10	(1) include in the district's Public Education
11	Information Management System (PEIMS) report additional
12	information specified by the agency and relating to the alternative
13	language education methods used by the district; and
14	(2) classify the alternative language education
15	method used by the district under the Public Education Information
16	Management System (PEIMS) report as specified by the agency.
17	SECTION 2. Section 48.105(a), Education Code, is amended to
18	read as follows:
19	(a) For each student in average daily attendance in a
20	bilingual education or special language program under Subchapter ${\tt B}$ ,
21	Chapter 29, or an alternative language method offered by a school
22	district and approved by the agency under Section 29.054(d), a
23	district is entitled to an annual allotment equal to the basic
24	allotment multiplied by:

1 (1) for an emergent bilingual student, as defined by 2 Section 29.052: 3 (A) 0.1; or 4 (B) 0.15 if the student is in a bilingual education program or an alternative language method offered by a 5 6 school district and approved by the agency under Section 29.054(d) 7 using a dual language immersion/one-way or two-way program model; 8 and (2) for a student not described by Subdivision (1), 9 0.05 if the student is in a bilingual education program or an 10 alternative language method offered by a school district and 11 approved by the agency under Section 29.054(d) using a dual 12 language immersion/two-way program model. 13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023. 14
