5	SECTION 1. Subchapter L, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 411.3555 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 411.3555. LOCAL AREA ACTIVATION FOR CERTAIN MISSING
8	CHILDREN. On the request of a local law enforcement agency that
9	knows a child is missing but has not verified the criteria described
10	by Section 411.355(a), and if the chief law enforcement officer of
11	the local law enforcement agency believes that activation of the
12	alert system is warranted, the department shall:
13	(1) activate the alert system only in the following
14	areas:
15	(A) within a 100-mile radius of the location from
16	which the child is believed to have gone missing or the location in
17	which the child was last seen, as applicable; and
18	(B) in all counties adjacent to the county from
19	which the child is believed to have gone missing or the county in
20	which the child was last seen, as applicable; and
21	(2) notify appropriate participants in the alert
22	system, as established by rule.
23	SECTION 2. Section 411.356, Government Code, is amended to

Sec. 411.356. LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES. Before 1 requesting activation of the alert system, a local law enforcement 2 agency must verify that the criteria described by Section 3 4 411.355(a) or (b) or 411.3555, as applicable, have been satisfied. On verification of the applicable criteria, the local 5 6 law enforcement agency shall immediately contact the department to request activation and shall supply the necessary information on 7 8 the forms prescribed by the director.

9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
