4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 13, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 2053 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 2053. YOUTH SPORTS PROGRAMS
8	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
9	Sec. 2053.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Advisory board" means the youth sports program
11	advisory board.
12	(2) "Commission" means the Texas Commission of
13	Licensing and Regulation.
14	(3) "Department" means the Texas Department of
15	Licensing and Regulation.
16	(4) "Executive director" means the executive director
17	of the department.
18	(5) "Youth sports program" means an organized
19	competitive sports program that:
20	(A) provides instruction for an Olympic or
21	University Interscholastic League sponsored or sanctioned sport;
22	(B) is not associated with a school; and
23	(C) instructs children who are enrolled in
24	kindergarten through 12th grade in a public, private, or charter

1	school or children of similar age who are provided an education in a
2	home setting.
3	SUBCHAPTER B. YOUTH SPORTS PROGRAM ADVISORY BOARD
4	Sec. 2053.051. YOUTH SPORTS PROGRAM ADVISORY BOARD. (a)
5	The youth sports program advisory board consists of nine members
6	appointed by the presiding officer of the commission with the
7	approval of the commission, as follows:
8	(1) two members who are physicians licensed in this
9	state specializing in orthopedic surgery and sports medicine;
10	(2) two members who are physicians licensed in this
11	state specializing in neurology;
12	(3) one member who is a psychologist licensed in this
13	state specializing in youth psychology;
14	(4) one member who is the current or former chief law
15	enforcement officer of a county or municipality; and
16	(5) three members who represent the public.
17	(b) Appointments to the advisory board shall be made without
18	regard to the race, color, disability, sex, religion, age, or
19	national origin of the appointee.
20	Sec. 2053.052. TERMS. Members of the advisory board serve
21	staggered six-year terms, with the terms of three members expiring
22	January 31 of each odd-numbered year.
23	Sec. 2053.053. VACANCY. If a vacancy occurs during a term
24	of a member of the advisory board, the presiding officer of the
25	commission, with the commission's approval, shall appoint a
26	replacement who meets the qualifications for the vacant position to
27	serve for the remainder of the term.

1 Sec. 2053.054. PRESIDING OFFICER. (a) The presiding 2 officer of the commission shall designate a member of the advisory 3 board to serve as the presiding officer of the advisory board for a 4 term of two years. 5 (b) The presiding officer of the advisory board may vote on any matter before the advisory board. 6 7 Sec. 2053.055. DUTIES OF ADVISORY BOARD. The advisory board shall provide advice and recommendations to the department on 8 technical matters relevant to the administration of this chapter. 9 10 SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES OF COMMISSION AND DEPARTMENT Sec. 2053.101. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. The department 11 12 shall: 13 (1) administer and enforce this chapter; 14 (2) evaluate the qualifications of license 15 applicants; 16 (3) issue licenses; 17 (4) in connection with a hearing under this chapter, issue subpoenas, examine witnesses, and administer oaths under the 18 19 laws of this state; and 20 (5) investigate persons engaging in practices that violate this chapter. 21 Sec. 2053.102. RULES. The commission shall adopt rules 22 consistent with this chapter for the administration and enforcement 23 24 of this chapter. 25 Sec. 2053.103. FEES. The commission by rule shall set fees 26 in amounts reasonable and necessary to cover the costs of 27 administering this chapter.

The department shall establish and maintain a toll-free 2 telephone number for reporting suspected violations of this chapter 3 or rules adopted under this chapter and other safety concerns. 4 5 Sec. 2053.105. EVALUATION OF CONCUSSION PROTOCOL. (a) The department shall evaluate a concussion protocol submitted by a 6 7 youth sports program for the department's approval as required by 8 Section 2053.202. 9 (b) The commission by rule shall establish criteria for the 10 approval of a concussion protocol under this section. Sec. 2053.106. EVALUATION OF VENUE SAFETY PROTOCOL. (a) 11 12 The department shall evaluate a venue safety protocol submitted by a youth sports program for the department's approval as required by 13 14 Section 2053.203. 15 (b) The commission by rule shall establish criteria for the approval of a venue safety protocol under this section. 16 17 SUBCHAPTER D. LICENSE Sec. 2053.151. LICENSE REQUIRED. A person may not operate a 18 19 youth sports program unless the person holds a license issued in accordance with this chapter. 20 21 Sec. 2053.152. APPLICATION; FEE. An applicant for a 22 license under this chapter must: 23 (1) submit an application in the manner and on a form 24 prescribed by the department; and 25 (2) pay the application fee set by commission rule. 26 Sec. 2053.153. ELIGIBILITY. To be eligible for a license 27 under this chapter, a license applicant must satisfy the

1	eligibility requirements established by commission rule.
2	Sec. 2053.154. ISSUANCE. The commission shall issue a
3	license to an applicant if the commission finds the applicant
4	satisfies the requirements of this chapter and commission rules.
5	Sec. 2053.155. TERM. A license issued under this chapter is
6	valid for the term established by commission rule.
7	Sec. 2053.156. RENEWAL. A license issued under this
8	chapter may be renewed as provided by commission rules.
9	SUBCHAPTER E. OPERATION OF YOUTH SPORTS PROGRAMS
10	Sec. 2053.201. SAFETY TRAINING REQUIRED. An individual may
11	not serve as a coach or trainer for a youth sports program unless
12	the person successfully completes a safety training course that is
13	substantially similar to the extracurricular activity safety
14	training program developed and adopted by the University
15	Interscholastic League under Section 33.202, Education Code.
16	Sec. 2053.202. CONCUSSION PROTOCOL REQUIRED. A person may
17	not operate a youth sports program unless the person develops and
18	implements a concussion protocol for the program that is approved
19	by the department in accordance with Section 2053.105.
20	Sec. 2053.203. VENUE SAFETY PROTOCOL REQUIRED. A person
21	may not operate a youth sports program unless the person develops
22	and implements a venue safety protocol that is approved by the
23	department in accordance with Section 2053.106 for the venue at
24	which the program will operate.
25	SUBCHAPTER F. DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS AND ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURES
26	Sec. 2053.251. DISCIPLINARY ACTION. In accordance with
27	Section 51.353, the commission or executive director may deny,

1 revoke, or suspend a license, refuse to renew a license, place on 2 probation a person whose license has been suspended, or reprimand a license holder for a violation of this chapter, a rule adopted under 3 this chapter, or an order of the commission or executive director. 4 5 Sec. 2053.252. ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURES. The commission, department, or executive director may enforce this chapter, a rule 6 adopted under this chapter, or an order of the commission or 7 8 executive director as provided by Subchapters F and G, Chapter 51.

9 SECTION 2. Not later than May 1, 2024, the Texas Commission 10 of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt the rules, procedures, and 11 fees necessary to administer Chapter 2053, Occupations Code, as 12 added by this Act.

13 SECTION 3. (a) Not later than January 1, 2024, the presiding 14 officer of the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall 15 appoint members to the advisory board created under Section 16 2053.051, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.

(b) Notwithstanding Section 2053.053, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, in making the initial appointments to the advisory board, the presiding officer of the commission shall designate three members to serve terms expiring January 31, 2025, three members to serve terms expiring January 31, 2027, and three members to serve terms expiring January 31, 2029.

SECTION 4. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this
section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

(b) Section 2053.151, Occupations Code, as added by this
Act, and Subchapter F, Chapter 2053, Occupations Code, as added by
this Act, take effect September 1, 2024.
