A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to allowing public schools to employ or accept as

- 3 volunteers chaplains.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subtitle D, Title 2, Education Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Chapter 23 to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 23. SCHOOL CHAPLAINS
- 8 Sec. 23.001. SCHOOL CHAPLAINS. A school district or an
- 9 open-enrollment charter school may employ or accept as a volunteer
- 10 a chaplain to provide support, services, and programs for students
- 11 as assigned by the board of trustees of the district or the
- 12 governing body of the school. A chaplain employed or volunteering
- 13 under this chapter is not required to be certified by the State
- 14 Board for Educator Certification.
- SECTION 2. Section 48.115(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 (b) Funds allocated under this section must be used to
- 18 improve school safety and security, including costs associated
- 19 with:
- 20 (1) securing school facilities, including:
- 21 (A) improvements to school infrastructure;
- (B) the use or installation of physical barriers;
- 23 and
- 24 (C) the purchase and maintenance of:

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- 1 (i) security cameras or other security
- 2 equipment; and
- 3 (ii) technology, including communications
- 4 systems or devices, that facilitates communication and information
- 5 sharing between students, school personnel, and first responders in
- 6 an emergency;
- 7 (2) providing security for the district, including:
- 8 (A) employing school district peace officers,
- 9 private security officers, and school marshals; and
- 10 (B) collaborating with local law enforcement
- 11 agencies, such as entering into a memorandum of understanding for
- 12 the assignment of school resource officers to schools in the
- 13 district;
- 14 (3) school safety and security training and planning,
- 15 including:
- 16 (A) active shooter and emergency response
- 17 training;
- 18 (B) prevention and treatment programs relating
- 19 to addressing adverse childhood experiences; and
- 20 (C) the prevention, identification, and
- 21 management of emergencies and threats, using evidence-based,
- 22 effective prevention practices and including:
- 23 (i) providing licensed counselors, social
- 24 workers, chaplains, and individuals trained in restorative
- 25 discipline and restorative justice practices;
- 26 (ii) providing mental health personnel and
- 27 support, including chaplains;

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- 1 (iii) providing behavioral health
- 2 services, including services provided by chaplains;
- 3 (iv) establishing threat reporting
- 4 systems; and
- 5 (v) developing and implementing programs
- 6 focused on restorative justice practices, culturally relevant
- 7 instruction, and providing mental health support, including
- 8 support provided by chaplains; and
- 9 (4) providing programs related to suicide prevention,
- 10 intervention, and postvention, including programs provided by
- 11 chaplains.
- 12 SECTION 3. Each board of trustees of a school district and
- 13 each governing body of an open-enrollment charter school shall take
- 14 a record vote not later than six months after the effective date of
- 15 this Act on whether to adopt a policy authorizing a campus of the
- 16 district or school to employ or accept as a volunteer a chaplain
- 17 under Chapter 23, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 19 school year.
- 20 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
