H.B. No. 3642

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the permissible uses of the school safety allotment 3 under the public school finance system. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 48.115(b), Education Code, is amended to 5 read as follows: 6 7 (b) Funds allocated under this section must be used to improve school safety and security, including costs associated 8 with: 9 (1) securing school facilities, including: 10 11 (A) improvements to school infrastructure; 12 (B) the use or installation of physical barriers; 13 and 14 (C) the purchase and maintenance of: 15 (i) security cameras or other security 16 equipment; and 17 (ii) technology, including communications systems or devices, that facilitates communication and information 18 sharing between students, school personnel, and first responders in 19 20 an emergency; 21 (2) providing security for the district, including: 22 (A) employing school district peace officers, 23 private security officers, and school marshals; and (B) collaborating with local law enforcement 24

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1 agencies, such as entering into a memorandum of understanding for the assignment of school resource officers to schools in the 2 3 district; 4 (3) school safety and security training and planning, 5 including: 6 (A) active emergency shooter and response 7 training; 8 (B) prevention and treatment programs relating 9 to addressing adverse childhood experiences; and 10 (C) the prevention, identification, and management of emergencies and threats, using evidence-based, 11 12 effective prevention practices and including: (i) providing licensed counselors, social 13 14 workers, and individuals trained in restorative discipline and 15 restorative justice practices; 16 (ii) providing mental health personnel and 17 support; behavioral 18 (iii) providing health 19 services; (iv) 20 establishing threat reporting 21 systems; 22 (v) providing professional development opportunities for educators regarding classroom behavioral 23 24 management; and 25 (vi) [<del>(v)</del>] developing and implementing 26 programs focused on restorative justice practices, culturally relevant instruction, and providing mental health support; and 27

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(4) providing programs related to suicide prevention,
intervention, and postvention.

3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
