9	the department may not consider a record of a conviction of a
10	license holder that is received by the department after the first
11	anniversary of the date of the conviction in a decision to impose an
12	enforcement action against the license holder, including a decision
13	to suspend, revoke, or deny renewal of the license holder's driver's
14	license.
15	(g) The department may consider a record of a conviction of
16	a license holder that is received by the department after the first
17	anniversary of the date of the conviction in a decision to impose an
18	enforcement action against the license holder if:
19	(1) the license holder:
20	(A) is a commercial driver's license holder or
21	was a commercial driver's license holder at the time of the offense;
22	(B) was operating a commercial motor vehicle at
23	the time of the offense; or
24	(C) was operating a motor vehicle and

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1 transporting a hazardous material at the time of the offense; or

- 2 (2) the conviction is for an offense under Chapter 49,
- 3 Penal Code.
- 4 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
