## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of a rural dual credit grant program by the
3	Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 61.0765 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 61.0765. RURAL DUAL CREDIT GRANT PROGRAM. (a) The
8	board shall establish a grant program under which the board awards
9	grants to eligible public junior colleges to provide financial
10	assistance to educationally disadvantaged high school students for
11	all or part of the cost of enrolling in dual credit courses at the
12	college.
13	(b) A public junior college is eligible to receive a grant
14	under the grant program if the college is in the small or medium
15	public junior college peer group, as identified by the board.
16	(c) A public junior college that receives a grant under the
17	<pre>grant program must:</pre>
18	(1) use the grant funds to provide financial
19	assistance to eligible students for all or part of the cost of
20	tuition and required fees for dual credit courses at the college;
21	(2) work with high schools that partner with the
22	college to provide dual credit courses and elect to participate in
23	the grant program to:

(A) inform eligible students regarding the grant

- program and how those courses relate to postsecondary education and 2 career paths; and 3 (B) assist eligible students in applying to enroll in those courses; and 4 5 (3) collect and report to the board data on: (A) participation rates of eligible students in 6 7 the grant program; 8 (B) outreach efforts regarding the grant
- 10 (C) the percentage of eligible students
- receiving financial assistance under the grant program who graduate 11

- 13 (i) in the top 10 percent of the student's

- 17 (d) A student is eligible to receive financial assistance
- from a public junior college under the grant program if the student: 18
- 19 (1) is educationally disadvantaged, as defined by
- Section 5.001; 20
- 21 (2) is enrolled in a participating public or private
- high school, including a home school, in the service area of the 22
- 23 college; and
- 24 (3) has completed less than 60 semester credit hours
- at an institution of higher education. 25
- (e) Funds provided to an eligible student under the grant 26
- program must be used for the cost of tuition or required fees for 27

- 1 <u>dual credit courses at the public junior college.</u>
- 2 (f) A public or private high school, including a home
- 3 school, that partners with a public junior college to provide dual
- 4 credit courses and elects to participate in the grant program must
- 5 provide to students in grade nine or the equivalent information
- 6 regarding dual credit opportunities and the funding available for
- 7 <u>dual credit courses under the grant program.</u>
- 8 SECTION 2. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 9 shall establish the grant program under Section 61.0765, Education
- 10 Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable following the
- 11 effective date of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
