- 20 (c) The limitation prescribed by Subsection (b) does not
- apply to an ordinance, order, or other measure that relates to: 21
- 22 (1) a state supported living center, as defined by
- Section 531.002, Health and Safety Code; 23
- 24 (2) a hospital that is owned or operated by this state,

- 1 an agency of this state, or the federal government; or
- 2 (3) subject to any applicable guidance provided by the
- 3 Texas Commission on Jail Standards, a facility operated by the
- 4 Texas Department of Criminal Justice or the Texas Juvenile Justice
- 5 Department or a municipal or county jail.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
