A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the authority of the Harris County Hospital District to 3 employ and commission peace officers. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 281.057, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 (a) The board of the Dallas County Hospital District, the 7 Tarrant County Hospital District, the Bexar County Hospital 8 District, [or] the El Paso County Hospital District, or the Harris 9 County Hospital District may employ and commission peace officers 10 11 for the district. 12 SECTION 2. Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, is amended to read as follows: 13 14 Art. 2.12. WHO ARE PEACE OFFICERS. The following are peace officers: 15 sheriffs, their deputies, and those reserve (1) 16 deputies who hold a permanent peace officer license issued under 17 Chapter 1701, Occupations Code; 18 constables, deputy constables, and those reserve 19 (2) 20 deputy constables who hold a permanent peace officer license issued 21 under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code; 22 (3) marshals or police officers of an incorporated 23 city, town, or village, and those reserve municipal police officers who hold a permanent peace officer license issued under Chapter 24

1 1701, Occupations Code;

2 (4) rangers, officers, and members of the reserve
3 officer corps commissioned by the Public Safety Commission and the
4 Director of the Department of Public Safety;

5 (5) investigators of the district attorneys', criminal
6 district attorneys', and county attorneys' offices;

7 (6) law enforcement agents of the Texas Alcoholic8 Beverage Commission;

9 (7) each member of an arson investigating unit 10 commissioned by a city, a county, or the state;

11 (8) officers commissioned under Section 37.081,
12 Education Code, or Subchapter E, Chapter 51, Education Code;

13 (9) officers commissioned by the General Services 14 Commission;

15 (10) law enforcement officers commissioned by the 16 Parks and Wildlife Commission;

17 (11) officers commissioned under Chapter 23,
18 Transportation Code;

19 (12) municipal park and recreational patrolmen and20 security officers;

(13) security officers and investigators commissioned
as peace officers by the comptroller;

(14) officers commissioned by a water control and
improvement district under Section 49.216, Water Code;

(15) officers commissioned by a board of trustees

19 (30) commission investigators commissioned by the 20 Texas Private Security Board under Section 1702.061, Occupations 21 Code;

(31) the fire marshal and any officers, inspectors, or investigators commissioned by an emergency services district under Chapter 775, Health and Safety Code;

(32) officers commissioned by the State Board of
Dental Examiners under Section 254.013, Occupations Code, subject
to the limitations imposed by that section;

(33) investigators commissioned by the Texas Juvenile
 Justice Department as officers under Section 221.011, Human
 Resources Code; and

4 (34) the fire marshal and any related officers,
5 inspectors, or investigators commissioned by a county under
6 Subchapter B, Chapter 352, Local Government Code.

7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
