- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. This Act may be cited as Tucker's Law.
- 6 SECTION 2. Subchapter Z, Chapter 29, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 29.9074 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 29.9074. FENTANYL POISONING AWARENESS WEEK. (a) To
- 9 educate students about the dangers posed by the drug fentanyl and
- 10 the risks of fentanyl poisoning, including overdose, the governor
- 11 shall designate a week to be known as Fentanyl Poisoning Awareness
- 12 Week in public schools.
- 13 <u>(b) Fentanyl Poisoning Awareness Week may include</u>
- 14 age-appropriate instruction, including instruction on the
- 15 prevention of the abuse of and addiction to fentanyl, as determined
- 16 by each school district.
- 17 SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 38, Education Code, is
- 18 amended by adding Section 38.040 to read as follows:
- 19 <u>Sec. 38.040. FENTANYL ABUSE PREVENTION AND DRUG POISONING</u>
- 20 AWARENESS EDUCATION. (a) Each school district shall annually
- 21 provide research-based instruction related to fentanyl abuse
- 22 prevention and drug poisoning awareness to students in grades 6
- 23 through 12.
- 24 (b) The instruction required by this section must include:

- 1 (1) suicide prevention; 2 (2) prevention of the abuse of and addiction to 3 fentanyl; 4 (3) awareness of local school and community resources 5 and any processes involved in accessing those resources; and 6 (4) health education that includes information about substance use and abuse, including youth substance use and abuse. 7 8 (c) The instruction required by this section may be provided by an entity or an employee or agent of an entity that is: 9 10 (1) a public or private institution of higher education; 11 (2) <u>a library;</u> 12 13 (3) a community service organization; 14 (4) a religious organization; 15 (5) a local public health agency; or 16 (6) an organization employing mental health 17 professionals. SECTION 4. Section 38.351, Education Code, is amended by 18 adding Subsection (g-1) to read as follows: 19 (g-1) A school district may satisfy a requirement to 20 implement a program in the area of substance abuse prevention and 21 intervention by providing instruction related to youth substance 22
