4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 38, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 38.040 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 38.040. FENTANYL PREVENTION AND DRUG POISONING
8	AWARENESS EDUCATION. (a) Each school district shall annually
9	provide not fewer than 10 hours of research-based instruction
10	related to fentanyl prevention and drug poisoning awareness to
11	students in grades 6 through 12.
12	(b) The instruction required by this section must include:
13	(1) recognition of signs and symptoms of mental health
14	issues;
15	(2) suicide prevention;
16	(3) prevention of the abuse of and addiction to
17	<pre>fentanyl;</pre>
18	(4) awareness of local school and community resources
19	and any processes involved in accessing those resources; and
20	(5) health education that includes information about
21	substance use and abuse, including youth substance use and abuse.
22	(c) The instruction required by this section may be provided
23	by an entity or an employee or agent of an entity that is:
24	(1) a public or private institution of higher

2	(2) a library;
3	(3) a community service organization;
4	(4) a religious organization;
5	(5) a local public health agency; or
6	(6) an organization employing mental health
7	professionals.
8	SECTION 2. Section 38.351, Education Code, is amended by
9	adding Subsection (g-1) to read as follows:
10	(g-1) A school district may satisfy a requirement to
11	implement a program in the area of substance abuse prevention and
12	intervention by providing instruction related to youth substance
13	use and abuse education under Section 38.040.
14	SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
15	school year.
16	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
17	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
18	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
19	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
20	Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
