- 8 FOR COMPANY LICENSE ISSUANCE. Before the department may issue a
- 9 company license under this chapter, the department must inspect the
- 10 employment records of the applicant to confirm that the applicant
- 11 has not misclassified employees as independent contractors in
- 12 violation of applicable federal guidelines.
- SECTION 2. Section 1702.127, Occupations Code, is amended
- 14 by adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:
- 15 (b-1) A company license holder may not intentionally
- 16 misclassify an employee as an independent contractor in violation
- 17 of applicable federal guidelines.
- 18 SECTION 3. Subchapter M, Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is
- 19 amended by adding Section 1702.3025 to read as follows:
- 20 <u>Sec. 1702.3025. VERIFICATION OF EMPLOYMENT CLASSIFICATION</u>
- 21 FOR COMPANY LICENSE RENEWAL. Before the department may renew a
- 22 company license under this chapter, the department must inspect the
- 23 employment records of the license holder to confirm that the
- 24 license holder has not misclassified employees as independent

- 1 contractors in violation of applicable federal guidelines.
- 2 SECTION 4. Sections 1702.116 and 1702.3025, Occupations
- 3 Code, as added by this Act, apply only to an application for the
- 4 issuance or renewal of a company license under Chapter 1702,
- 5 Occupations Code, that is submitted on or after the effective date
- 6 of this Act. An application submitted before the effective date of
- 7 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the
- 8 application was submitted, and the former law is continued in
- 9 effect for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
