5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 102.251, Health and Safety Code, is
7	amended by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
8	(f) The institute may not award a grant to an applicant
9	whose proposed research project requires the applicant to procure
10	or otherwise obtain from a hospital located in China an organ for
11	organ transplantation or another purpose.
12	SECTION 2. Section 102.255(c), Health and Safety Code, is
13	amended to read as follows:
14	(c) The contract must:
15	(1) include terms relating to intellectual property
16	rights consistent with the standards developed by the oversight
17	committee under Section 102.256;
18	(2) require, in accordance with Subsection (d), the
19	grant recipient to dedicate an amount of matching funds equal to
20	one-half of the amount of the research grant awarded; [ <del>and</del> ]
21	(3) specify:
22	(A) the amount of matching funds to be dedicated
23	under Subdivision (2);
24	(B) the period in which the grant award must be

1 spent;

2 (C) the name of the research project to which3 matching funds are to be dedicated; and

4 (D) the specific deliverables of the project that
5 is the subject of the grant proposal; and

6 <u>(4) require a grant recipient to certify in writing as</u> 7 <u>a term of the contract that the recipient will not use grant money</u> 8 <u>awarded under this chapter to procure or otherwise obtain from a</u> 9 <u>hospital located in China an organ for organ transplantation or</u> 10 <u>another purpose</u>.

11 SECTION 3. (a) The changes in law made by this Act apply 12 only to a grant awarded or contract entered into or renewed under 13 Chapter 102, Health and Safety Code, on or after the effective date 14 of this Act.

15 (b) The Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas shall seek to amend the terms of each contract entered into with a 16 17 grant recipient under Chapter 102, Health and Safety Code, before the effective date of this Act to require the recipient to comply 18 with Section 102.255(c)(4), Health and Safety Code, as added by 19 this Act. To the extent of a conflict between that subdivision and 20 a provision of a contract with a grant recipient entered into before 21 the effective date of this Act, the contract provision prevails. 22
