- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 16, Civil Practice and
- 6 Remedies Code, is amended by adding Section 16.039 to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 Sec. 16.039. ANNEXATION. A person must bring suit to
- 9 challenge a municipal annexation of land not later than the 35th
- 10 anniversary of the annexation date.
- 11 SECTION 2. Subchapter Z, Chapter 43, Local Government Code,
- 12 is amended by adding Section 43.909 to read as follows:
- Sec. 43.909. MUNICIPAL BOUNDARIES. Notwithstanding any
- 14 other law, municipal boundaries may not be validated for purposes
- 15 of this chapter. Compliance with this chapter is required
- 16 notwithstanding any other law that purports to validate a municipal
- 17 boundary unless that law explicitly validates the boundary for
- 18 purposes of this chapter.
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 51.003(b), Local Government Code, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 (b) This section does not apply to:
- 22 (1) an act or proceeding that was void at the time it
- 23 occurred;
- 24 (2) an act or proceeding that, under a statute of this

- 1 state or the United States, was a misdemeanor or felony at the time
- 2 the act or proceeding occurred;
- 3 (3) an incorporation or attempted incorporation of a
- 4 municipality[or an annexation or attempted annexation of
- 5 territory by a municipality, within the incorporated boundaries or
- 6 extraterritorial jurisdiction of another municipality that
- 7 occurred without the consent of the other municipality in violation
- 8 of Chapter 42 or 43;
- 9 (4) an ordinance that, at the time it was passed, was
- 10 preempted by a statute of this state or the United States, including
- 11 Section 1.06 or 109.57, Alcoholic Beverage Code; [or]
- 12 (5) a matter that on the effective date of this
- 13 section:
- 14 (A) is involved in litigation if the litigation
- 15 ultimately results in the matter being held invalid by a final
- 16 judgment of a court; or
- 17 (B) has been held invalid by a final judgment of a
- 18 court; or
- 19 <u>(6) an ordinance annexing land.</u>
- 20 SECTION 4. The following provisions of the Local Government
- 21 Code are repealed:
- 22 (1) Section 41.003; and
- 23 (2) Section 43.901.
- 24 SECTION 5. Section 16.039, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 25 Code, as added by this Act, applies only to an action filed on or
- 26 after the effective date of this Act. An action filed before the
- 27 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the

- 1 date the action was filed, and the former law is continued in effect
- 2 for that purpose.
- 3 SECTION 6. Section 43.909, Local Government Code, as added
- 4 by this Act, does not affect the validity of a municipal boundary
- 5 validated according to law before the effective date of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 7. Section 51.003(b), Local Government Code, as
- 7 amended by this Act, applies only to a municipal ordinance annexing
- 8 land that is adopted by the governing body of a municipality on or
- 9 after the effective date of this Act. An ordinance annexing land
- 10 that is adopted before the effective date of this Act is governed by
- 11 the law in effect on the date the ordinance was adopted, and the
- 12 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 8. The repeal by this Act of Sections 41.003 and
- 14 43.901, Local Government Code, applies only to a municipal
- 15 ordinance adopted on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 16 municipal ordinance adopted before the effective date of this Act
- 17 is governed by the law in effect on the date the ordinance was
- 18 adopted, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 19 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
