12	(ii Utility system, water supply project,

14	facility, wharf, dock, or flood control and drainage project;
15	(iii) Police stations, fire stations, or
16	other public safety facilities, emergency shelters, jails,
17	juvenile detention facilities, judicial facilities, animal
18	shelters, libraries;
19	(iv) Administrative office buildings for
20	housing governmental functions of a municipality or county; or
21	(v) Parks and recreation facilities that
22	are generally accessible to the public and are dedicated as part of
23	the municipal or county park system.

1	semi-professional or professional sports, stadia, arenas, civic
2	centers, convention centers, hotels, or coliseums.
3	SECTION 2. Section 1431.001, Government Code, is amended by
4	adding Subdivision (7) to read as follows:
5	(7) "Public work" for a municipality or county has the
6	meaning assigned by Section 271.043(7-a), Local Government Code.
7	SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
8	a certificate of obligation or tax anticipation note issued on or
9	after the effective date of this Act. A certificate of obligation
10	or tax anticipation note issued before the effective date of this
11	Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before the
12	effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in
13	effect for that purpose.
14	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
