H.B. No. 4112

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the availability of free prekindergarten programs in 3 public schools. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Sections 29.153(a-1), (b), and (f), Education 5 Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a-1) A district shall offer prekindergarten classes if the district identifies 15 or more children who are [eligible under 8 Subsection (b) and are] at least four years of age. A school 9 district may offer prekindergarten classes if the district 10 11 identifies 15 or more [eligible] children who are eligible under 12 Subsection (b)(1) [at least three years of age]. A district may not charge tuition for a prekindergarten class offered under this 13 14 section. A child is eligible for enrollment in a prekindergarten 15 (b) class under this section if the child is: 16 (1) at least three years of age and: 17 18 (A) [(1)] is unable to speak and comprehend the English language; 19 is educationally disadvantaged; 20 (B) [(2)] 21 <u>(C)</u> [(3)] is homeless, regardless of the residence of the child, of either parent of the child, or of the 22 child's guardian or other person having lawful control of the 23 24 child;

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H.B. No. 4112 1 (D) [(4)] is the child of an active duty member of the armed forces of the United States, including the state 2 3 military forces or a reserve component of the armed forces, who is ordered to active duty by proper authority; 4 5 (E) [(5)] is the child of a member of the armed forces of the United States, including the state military forces or 6 a reserve component of the armed forces, who was injured or killed 7 8 while serving on active duty; (F) [(6)] is or ever has been in: 9 10 <u>(i)</u> [(A)] the conservatorship of the Department of Family and Protective Services following an adversary 11 12 hearing held as provided by Section 262.201, Family Code; or 13 (ii) [(B)] foster care in another state or 14 territory, if the child resides in this state; or 15 (G) [(7)] is the child of a person eligible for 16 the Star of Texas Award as: 17 (i) [(A)] a peace officer under Section 3106.002, Government Code; 18 19 (ii) [(B)] a firefighter under Section 3106.003, Government Code; or 20 21 (iii) [(C)] an emergency medical first responder under Section 3106.004, Government Code; or 22 23 (2) at least four years of age. 24 (f) А child who is eligible for enrollment in а prekindergarten class under Subsection (b)(1)(D) or (E) [(b)(4) or 25 26 (5)] remains eligible for enrollment if the child's parent leaves

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the armed forces, or is no longer on active duty, after the child

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1 begins a prekindergarten class.

2 SECTION 2. Section 29.1532(c), Education Code, is amended 3 to read as follows:

4 (c) A school district that offers prekindergarten classes
5 shall include the following information in the district's Public
6 Education Information Management System (PEIMS) report:

7 (1) demographic information, as determined by the
8 commissioner, on students enrolled in district and campus
9 prekindergarten classes, including the number of students who are
10 eligible for classes under Section <u>29.153(b)(1) or (f)</u> [29.153];

11 (2) the numbers of half-day and full-day 12 prekindergarten classes offered by the district and campus;

13 (3) the number of half-day prekindergarten classes for 14 which the district has received an exemption from full-day 15 operation under Section 29.153(d);

16 (4) the sources of funding for the prekindergarten 17 classes;

18 (5) the class size and ratio of instructional staff to 19 students for each prekindergarten program class offered by the 20 district and campus;

(6) if the district elects to administer an assessment instrument under Section 29.169 to students enrolled in district and campus prekindergarten program classes, a description and the results of each type of assessment instrument; and

25 (7) curricula used in the district's prekindergarten26 program classes.

27 SECTION 3. Section 29.153(e-1), Education Code, is

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1 repealed.

2 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024 3 school year.

4 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
