4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 302, Labor Code, is
6	amended by adding Sections 302.0051 and 302.0063 to read as
7	follows:
8	Sec. 302.0051. PREKINDERGARTEN PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM. (a)
9	The commission shall establish and administer a prekindergarten
10	partnership program to assist Texas Rising Star program providers
11	who meet the definition of an eligible private provider under
12	Section 29.171, Education Code, in partnering with local school
13	districts and open-enrollment charter schools to provide the
14	prekindergarten classes required under Section 29.153, Education
15	<u>Code.</u>
16	(b) Using existing funds, the commission shall coordinate
17	with the Texas Education Agency to develop joint strategies to
18	expand the availability of prekindergarten partnership programs,
19	including by:
20	(1) establishing and maintaining a database of Texas
21	Rising Star program providers within the boundaries of each school
22	district and open-enrollment charter school;
23	(2) assisting in negotiating and administering
24	contracts between school districts or open-enrollment charter

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1	schools, as applicable, and Texas Rising Star program providers to
2	provide prekindergarten classes; and
3	(3) annually establishing guidelines for funding
4	amounts per child to be provided by a school district or
5	open-enrollment charter school, as applicable, to a Texas Rising
6	Star program provider with which the district or charter school
7	partners to provide prekindergarten classes.
8	Sec. 302.0063. CHILD-CARE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT
9	SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM. (a) In this section, "program" means the
10	professional development scholarship program established under
11	this section.
12	(b) From funds appropriated for the purpose, the commission
13	shall establish and administer a professional development
14	scholarship program for current and prospective child-care
15	workers.
16	(c) A scholarship under the program may be used to pay an
17	individual's costs related to:
18	(1) earning:
19	(A) a Child Development Associate (CDA)
20	credential; or
21	(B) an associate's degree or bachelor's degree in
22	early childhood education or another related field from a public or
23	private institution of higher education; and
24	(2) participation in a registered child-care
25	apprenticeship program.
26	(d) The program may be used to pay for other ancillary costs
27	for child-care workers who are enrolled in an educational program

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1	or apprenticeship program described by Subsection (c), including:
2	(1) books and supplies;
3	(2) release time or stipends to attend classes;
4	(3) costs related to the examination for the Child
5	Development Associate (CDA) credential;
6	(4) travel to attend classes or attend a hands-on
7	practicum training; and
8	(5) stipends for mentors or master teachers who
9	provide hands-on training at a child-care program.
10	SECTION 2. Section 2308.256(a), Government Code, is amended
11	to read as follows:
12	(a) A board is composed as follows:
13	(1) representatives of the private sector, who:
14	(A) constitute a majority of the membership of
15	the board; and
16	(B) are owners of business concerns, chief
17	executives or chief operating officers of nongovernmental
18	employers, or other private sector executives who have substantial
19	<pre>management or policy responsibilities;</pre>
20	(2) representatives of organized labor and
21	community-based organizations, who constitute not less than 15
22	percent of the membership of the board; and
23	(3) representatives of each of the following:
24	(A) educational agencies, including community
25	colleges and secondary and postsecondary practitioners
26	representing vocational education, that are representative of all
27	educational agencies in the service delivery area;
