A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the licensing of a psychologist as a licensed specialist in school psychology; authorizing a fee. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 501.260, Occupations Code, is amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (b-1) and (d) to 6 read as follows: 7 (b) The executive council shall set the standards to qualify 8 9 for a license under this section. Except as provided by Subsection (b-1), [The] standards must include: 10 11 (1) satisfaction of minimum recognized graduate 12 degree requirements; 13 completion of graduate course work at a regionally (2) 14 accredited institution of higher education in: 15 (A) psychological foundations; educational foundations; 16 (B) interventions; 17 (C) 18 (D) assessments; and professional issues and ethics; 19 (E) completion of at least 1,200 hours of supervised 20 (3) 21 experience; 22 (4) receipt of a passing score on a nationally 23 recognized qualifying examination determined to be appropriate by the executive council and on any other examination required by the 24

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1 executive council; and 2 (5) satisfaction of the requirements under Sections 501.2525(a)(3)-(9). 3 4 (b-1) The executive council by rule shall provide for the 5 issuance of a license under this section to a person who: 6 (1) is licensed as a psychologist under this chapter; (2) has received a passing score on a nationally 7 8 recognized qualifying examination determined to be appropriate by the executive council and on any other examination required by the 9 10 executive council; (3) applies for the license in the manner prescribed 11 12 by the executive council; and (4) pays the fee set by the executive council. 13 14 (d) The executive council by rule may establish continuing 15 education requirements for a psychologist who holds a license issued under this section in accordance with Subsection (b-1), 16 17 including continuing education coursework in an amount and frequency established by the executive council that is related to: 18 19 (1) the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. Section 1400 et seq.); 20 21 (2) Section 504, Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. Section 794); 22 23 (3) special education evaluations; and 24 (4) school-based psychological services. SECTION 2. The Texas Behavioral Health Executive Council 25 26 shall adopt rules and fees necessary to implement Sections 501.260(b-1) and (d), Occupations Code, as added by this Act, not 27

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1 later than January 1, 2024.

2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
