An offense under this subsection [training has not in fact been provided,] is 15 [guilty of] a misdemeanor punishable [and on conviction shall be 16 punished] by: 17 18 a fine of not more than $\frac{1,000}{3,000}$ [300]; and (1)30 hours of community service to be performed for a 19 (2) 20 governmental entity or nonprofit organization that primarily 21 serves persons with visual impairments or other disabilities, or for another entity or organization at the discretion of the court, 22

23 to be completed in not more than one year.

(b) A person who habitually abuses or neglects to feed or

otherwise neglects to properly care for <u>the person's</u> [his or her]
assistance animal <u>or service animal</u> is subject to seizure of the
animal under Subchapter B, Chapter 821, Health and Safety Code.

4 SECTION 2. Section 121.006(a), Human Resources Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to an offense committed on or 5 6 after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when 7 8 the offense was committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was 9 committed before the effective date of this Act if any element of 10 the offense occurred before that date. 11
