- 2 relating to enforcement actions taken against a child-care or 3 child-placing agency administrator's license.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 43.010(a), (b), and (d), Human
- 6 Resources Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The <u>commission</u> [department] may deny, revoke, suspend,
- 8 or refuse to renew a license, or place on probation or reprimand a
- 9 license holder for:
- 10 (1) violating this chapter or a rule adopted under
- 11 this chapter;

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- 12 (2) circumventing or attempting to circumvent the
- 13 requirements of this chapter or a rule adopted under this chapter;
- 14 (3) engaging in fraud or deceit related to the
- 15 requirements of this chapter or a rule adopted under this chapter;
- 16 (4) providing false or misleading information to the
- 17 commission [department] during the license application or renewal
- 18 process for any person's license;
- 19 (5) making a statement about a material fact during
- 20 the license application or renewal process that the person knows or
- 21 should know is false;
- 22 (6) having:
- 23 (A) a criminal history or central registry record
- 24 that would prohibit a person from working in a child-care facility,

- 1 as defined by Section 42.002, under rules applicable to that type of
- 2 facility; or
- 3 (B) a criminal history relevant to the duties of
- 4 a licensed child-care or child-placing administrator, as those
- 5 duties are specified in rules adopted by the executive
- 6 commissioner;
- 7 (7) using drugs or alcohol in a manner that
- 8 jeopardizes the person's ability to function as an administrator;
- 9 (8) performing duties as a child-care administrator in
- 10 a negligent manner; or
- 11 (9) engaging in conduct that makes the license holder
- 12 ineligible for:
- 13 (A) a <u>license</u>, <u>listing</u>, <u>registration</u>, <u>or</u>
- 14 certification of approval [permit] under Section 42.072; or
- 15 (B) employment as a controlling person or service
- 16 in that capacity in a facility or family home under Section 42.062.
- 17 (b) A person whose license is revoked or refused renewal by
- 18 the commission under Subsection (a) is not eligible to apply for
- 19 another license under this chapter for a period of five years after
- 20 the date the commission revoked the license [was revoked] or
- 21 refused to renew the license.
- 22 (d) If a license holder is placed on probation, the
- 23 <u>commission</u> [department] may require the license holder:
- 24 (1) to report regularly to the <u>commission</u> [department]
- 25 on the conditions of the probation;
- 26 (2) to limit practice to the areas prescribed by the
- 27 commission [department]; or

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- 1 (3) to continue or renew professional education until
- 2 the practitioner attains a degree of skill satisfactory to the
- 3 commission [department] in those areas in which improvement is a
- 4 condition of the probation.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 43.011, Human Resources Code, is
- 6 repealed.
- 7 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 8 43.010(b), Human Resources Code, applies only to a person whose
- 9 license is refused renewal by the Health and Human Services
- 10 Commission on or after the effective date of this Act. A person
- 11 whose license is refused renewal by the Health and Human Services
- 12 Commission before the effective date of this Act is governed by the
- 13 law in effect on the date the Health and Human Services Commission
- 14 refused to renew the license, and the former law is continued in
- 15 effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
