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H.B. No. 4172

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the authority of the governing body of a hospital 3 district to vote for candidates for director of the appraisal 4 district in which the hospital district participates.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Sections 6.03(c) and (e), Tax Code, are amended 7 to read as follows:

(c) Members of the board of directors other than a county 8 9 assessor-collector serving as a nonvoting director are appointed by vote of the governing bodies of the incorporated cities and towns, 10 11 the school districts, the junior college districts, the hospital 12 districts, and, if entitled to vote, the conservation and reclamation districts that participate in the district and of the 13 14 county. A governing body may cast all its votes for one candidate distribute them among candidates for 15 or any number of 16 directorships. Conservation and reclamation districts are not entitled to vote unless at least one conservation and reclamation 17 district in the district delivers to the chief appraiser a written 18 request to nominate and vote on the board of directors by June 1 of 19 20 each odd-numbered year. On receipt of a request, the chief 21 appraiser shall certify a list by June 15 of all eligible conservation and reclamation districts that are imposing taxes and 22 23 that participate in the district.

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(e) The chief appraiser shall calculate the number of votes

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1 to which each taxing unit other than a conservation and reclamation 2 district is entitled and shall deliver written notice to each of 3 those <u>taxing</u> units of its voting entitlement before October 1 of 4 each odd-numbered year. The chief appraiser shall deliver the 5 notice:

6 (1) to the county judge and each commissioner of the 7 county served by the appraisal district;

8 (2) to the presiding officer of the governing body of 9 each city or town participating in the appraisal district, to the 10 city manager of each city or town having a city manager, and to the 11 city secretary or clerk, if there is one, of each city or town that 12 does not have a city manager;

13 (3) to the presiding officer of the governing body of 14 each school district participating in the district and to the 15 superintendent of those school districts; [and]

16 (4) to the presiding officer of the governing body of 17 each junior college district participating in the district and to 18 the president, chancellor, or other chief executive officer of 19 those junior college districts<u>; and</u>

20 (5) to the presiding officer of the governing body and 21 the hospital administrator of each hospital district participating 22 in the district.

23 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 24 the selection of appraisal district directors for terms that begin 25 on or after January 1, 2024.

26 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
