- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 64.012(a) and (b), Election Code, are
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly or
- 8 intentionally:
- 9 (1) votes or attempts to vote in an election in which
- 10 the person knows of a particular circumstance that makes the person
- 11 [is] not eligible to vote;
- 12 (2) votes or attempts to vote more than once in an
- 13 election;
- 14 (3) votes or attempts to vote a ballot belonging to
- 15 another person, or by impersonating another person;
- 16 (4) marks or attempts to mark any portion of another
- 17 person's ballot without the consent of that person, or without
- 18 specific direction from that person how to mark the ballot; or
- 19 (5) votes or attempts to vote in an election in this
- 20 state after voting in another state in an election in which a
- 21 federal office appears on the ballot and the election day for both
- 22 states is the same day.
- 23 (b) An offense under this section is a <u>felony of the second</u>
- 24 degree unless the person is convicted of an attempt. In that case,

- 1 the offense is a state jail felony [Class A misdemeanor].
- 2 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 3 an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 4 offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed
- 5 by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former
- 6 law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this
- 7 section, an offense was committed before the effective date of this
- 8 Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
