A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 33.081, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (g) and adding Subsection (g-1) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (g) An appeal to the commissioner is not a contested case
- 9 under Chapter 2001, Government Code, if the issues presented relate
- 10 to a student's eligibility to participate in extracurricular
- 11 activities, including issues related to the [student's grades, the
- 12 school district's grading policy as applied to the student's
- 13 eligibility, or the] student's eligibility based on conduct
- 14 described by Subsection (e-1). The commissioner may delegate the
- 15 matter for decision to a person the commissioner designates. The
- 16 decision of the commissioner or the commissioner's designee in a
- 17 matter governed by this subsection may not be appealed except on the
- 18 grounds that the decision is arbitrary or capricious. Evidence may
- 19 not be introduced on appeal other than the record of the evidence
- 20 before the commissioner.
- 21 (g-1) An appeal relating to a student's grades or the school
- 22 <u>district's grading policy as applied to the student's eligibility</u>
- 23 to participate in extracurricular activities shall be heard
- 24 exclusively by the University Interscholastic League. An appeal

- 1 under this subsection shall be conducted in the same manner and is
- 2 subject to the same limitations as an appeal to the commissioner
- 3 <u>under Subsection (g).</u>
- 4 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 5 school year.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- $7\,$ a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
