4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 6, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 444 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 444. OFF-LABEL USE OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS
8	Sec. 444.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Off-label use" means the use of a prescription
10	drug approved for use by the United States Food and Drug
11	Administration in a manner other than the approved use.
12	(2) "Pharmacist" means a person licensed by the Texas
13	State Board of Pharmacy to practice pharmacy.
14	(3) "Physician" means an individual licensed by the
15	Texas Medical Board to practice medicine in this state.
16	Sec. 444.002. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies only to
17	the promoting, prescribing, administering, and dispensing of a
18	prescription drug the United States Food and Drug Administration
19	has approved for human use.
20	Sec. 444.003. PROHIBITED DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST
21	PHYSICIAN'S OR PHARMACIST'S LICENSE. The state agency with
22	licensing or regulatory authority over a physician or pharmacist
23	may not revoke, fail to renew, suspend, or take any other adverse
24	action against a physician's or pharmacist's license based solely

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1 on the physician or pharmacist: 2 (1) prescribing, administering, or dispensing a prescription drug for off-label use to treat a patient, unless such 3 authorities prove beyond a reasonable doubt that the prescribing, 4 5 administering, or dispensing led to the direct physical harm of a person who was a patient within the 3 years immediately preceding 6 7 the physical harm; or 8 (2) communicating or otherwise promoting to a patient an off-label use of a prescription drug, unless such authorities 9 prove beyond a reasonable doubt that the speech led to the direct 10 physical harm of a person who was a patient within the 3 years 11 12 immediately preceding the physical harm. SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 13 14 prescription issued or a prescription drug promoted, а administered, or dispensed on or after the effective date of this 15 16 Act.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
