5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 56, Education Code, is amended by adding
7	Subchapter S to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER S. FUTURE TEXAS TEACHERS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM
9	Sec. 56.501. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher
11	Education Coordinating Board.
12	(2) "Eligible institution" means a general academic
13	teaching institution or a private or independent institution of
14	higher education, as those terms are defined by Section 61.003,
15	that operates an eligible educator preparation program.
16	(3) "Enrolled full-time" means enrolled for at least
17	12 semester credit hours or participating in a clinical teaching
18	assignment or internship that meets criteria established by State
19	Board for Educator Certification rule for initial certification as
20	a classroom teacher.
21	(4) "Scholarship program" means the Future Texas
22	Teachers Scholarship Program authorized by this subchapter.
23	Sec. 56.502. PURPOSE. The Future Texas Teachers
24	Scholarship Program is created to recruit, prepare, and retain a

talented and diverse workforce of career teachers to be leaders in 1 2 their field and to provide assistance for tuition, mandatory fees, and other usual and customary costs of attendance at an eligible 3 institution as provided by Sections 56.506 and 56.507. 4 5 Sec. 56.503. ELIGIBLE EDUCATOR PREPARATION PROGRAMS. To be eligible to participate in the scholarship program, an educator 6 7 preparation program must: 8 (1) be operated by an eligible institution; 9 (2) provide a structured system of support to assist 10 scholarship recipients to successfully complete the educator preparation program; 11 12 (3) require additional hours of field-based experience for students above the minimum hours required by State 13 14 Board for Educator Certification rule; 15 (4) require additional hours of clinical teaching experience for students above the minimum hours required by State 16 17 Board for Educator Certification rule; (5) provide or <u>facilitate</u> opportunities 18 for 19 scholarship recipients to participate in learning opportunities beyond the university classroom setting; and 20 21 (6) comply with other eligibility criteria established by coordinating board rule. 22 Sec. 56.504. INITIAL STUDENT ELIGIBILITY FOR SCHOLARSHIP. 23 24 To be eligible initially for a scholarship under the (a) scholarship program, a person must: 25 26 (1) be a Texas resident under Section 54.052; 27 (2) either:

1	(A) be enrolled full-time in an eligible
2	institution; or
3	(B) have applied for admission to an eligible
4	institution and enroll full-time in that institution in the
5	academic year immediately following the person's application;
6	(3) once enrolled full-time in an eligible
7	institution, be working toward a baccalaureate or master's degree
8	and on track to be admitted to an eligible educator preparation
9	program, as verified by the eligible institution operating the
10	educator preparation program;
11	(4) demonstrate a commitment to pursuing a career as a
12	classroom teacher in a public school in this state:
13	(A) in a teaching field identified by the
14	commissioner of education as experiencing a critical shortage of
15	teachers in this state; or
16	(B) in a public school in this state in which a
17	majority of students enrolled are educationally disadvantaged;
18	(5) comply with Section 28.0256;
19	(6) complete a criminal history background check from:
20	(A) any law enforcement or criminal justice
21	agency; or
22	(B) a private entity that is a consumer reporting
23	agency governed by the Fair Credit Reporting Act (15 U.S.C. Section
24	<u>1681 et seq.);</u>
25	(7) provide the educator preparation program with the
26	completed background check report and any supplemental
27	documentation the program may request to evaluate the background

1	check report for the purposes of this section; and
2	(8) comply with any other academic or nonacademic
3	requirements adopted by the coordinating board under this
4	subchapter.
5	(b) A person is not eligible to receive a scholarship under
6	the scholarship program if the person has been convicted of a felony
7	or misdemeanor offense relating to the duties and responsibilities
8	of the education profession, including:
9	(1) an offense involving moral turpitude;
10	(2) an offense involving a form of sexual or physical
11	abuse of a minor or student or other illegal conduct in which the
12	victim is a minor or student;
13	(3) a felony offense involving the possession,
14	transfer, sale, or distribution of or conspiracy to possess,
15	transfer, sell, or distribute a controlled substance, as defined by
16	Chapter 481, Health and Safety Code, or by 21 U.S.C. Section 801 et
17	seq.;
18	(4) an offense involving the illegal transfer,
19	appropriation, or use of school district funds or other district
20	property; or
21	(5) an offense involving an attempt by fraudulent or
22	unauthorized means to obtain or alter a professional certificate or
23	license issued under Subchapter B, Chapter 21.
24	(c) An educator preparation program shall review the
25	background check documentation provided under Subsection (a)(7)
26	for the purposes of making a determination under Subsection (b).
27	Sec. 56.505. CONTINUING STUDENT ELIGIBILITY AND ACADEMIC

PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS. (a) After initially qualifying for a 1 2 scholarship under this subchapter, a person may continue to receive 3 a scholarship under the scholarship program during each semester or 4 term in which the person is enrolled at an eligible institution only 5 if the person: 6 (1) demonstrates a continued commitment to pursuing a 7 career as a classroom teacher: 8 (A) in a teaching field identified by the commissioner of education as experiencing a critical shortage of 9 10 teachers in this state; or (B) in a public school in this state in which a 11 12 majority of students enrolled are educationally disadvantaged; (2) remains enrolled full-time in an eligible 13 14 institution; 15 (3) remains enrolled in or is on track to be admitted to an eligible educator preparation program, as verified by the 16 17 eligible institution in which the person is enrolled; (4) makes satisfactory academic progress toward 18 19 completion of a baccalaureate or master's degree and approval to take a teacher certification exam, as verified by the eligible 20 institution; and 21 22 (5) complies with any other academic or nonacademic requirements adopted by the coordinating board under this 23 24 subchapter. (b) A person is not eligible to continue to receive a 25 26 scholarship under the scholarship program if the person has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor offense described by Section 27

2	(c) If a person fails to meet any of the requirements of
3	Subsection (a) after the completion of any semester or term, the
4	person may not receive a scholarship under this subchapter during
5	the next semester or term in which the person enrolls. A person may
6	become eligible to receive a scholarship under this subchapter in a
7	subsequent semester or term if the person:
8	(1) completes a semester or term during which the
9	person is not eligible for a scholarship; and
10	(2) meets all the requirements of Subsection (a).
11	(d) For the purpose of this section, a person makes
12	satisfactory academic progress toward a baccalaureate or master's
13	degree only if:
14	(1) in the person's first academic year the person
15	meets the satisfactory academic progress requirements of the
16	eligible institution in which the person is enrolled; and
17	(2) in a subsequent academic year, the person:
18	(A) completes at least 75 percent of the semester
19	credit hours attempted in the person's most recent academic year;
20	and
21	(B) has earned an overall grade point average of
22	at least 3.0 on a four-point scale or the equivalent on coursework
23	previously attempted at an eligible institution.
24	(e) A person who is eligible to receive a scholarship under
25	this subchapter continues to remain eligible to receive the
26	scholarship if the person enrolls in or transfers to an eligible
27	educator preparation program at another eligible institution.

(f) The coordinating board shall adopt rules to allow a 1 person who is otherwise eligible to receive a scholarship under 2 this subchapter, in the event of a hardship or for other good cause 3 shown, including a showing of a severe illness or other 4 debilitating condition that may affect the person's academic 5 performance or that the person is responsible for the care of a 6 7 sick, injured, or needy person and that the person's provision of 8 care may affect the person's academic performance, to receive a scholarship under this subchapter: 9 (1) while enrolled in a number of semester credit 10 hours that is less than the number required to be enrolled 11 12 full-time; or 13 (2) if the person's grade point average or completion 14 rate falls below the satisfactory academic progress requirements of 15 Subsection (d). (g) A person's eligibility for a scholarship under this 16 17 subchapter ends on the earlier of: 18 (1) the fourth anniversary of the initial award of a 19 scholarship under this subchapter to the person and the person's enrollment in an eligible institution; or 20 21 (2) the person's completion of the baccalaureate or master's degree program described by Section 56.504(a)(3). 22 Sec. 56.506. SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT. (a) Beginning with the 23 24 2024-2025 academic year, the amount of a scholarship under this subchapter is equal to the amount of the scholarship for the 25 26 preceding academic year, adjusted for inflation using the college tuition and fees index component of the consumer price index 27

1	produced by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics.
2	(a-1) For the 2023-2024 academic year, the amount of a
3	scholarship under this subchapter is \$12,000. This subsection
4	expires September 1, 2024.
5	(b) The amount of a scholarship under this subchapter may
6	not be reduced by any other scholarship, grant, or financial aid
7	which the scholarship recipient receives.
8	(c) Not later than January 31 of each year, the coordinating
9	board shall publish the amounts of each scholarship established by
10	the board for the academic year beginning the next fall semester.
11	Sec. 56.507. SCHOLARSHIP USE. A person receiving a
12	scholarship under this subchapter may use the money to pay any usual
13	and customary cost of attendance at an eligible institution
14	incurred by the person. The institution may disburse all or part of
15	the proceeds of a scholarship under this subchapter to an eligible
16	person only if the tuition and required fees incurred by the person
17	at the institution have been paid.
18	Sec. 56.508. ADMINISTRATION OF PROGRAM. (a) The
19	coordinating board shall adopt any rules necessary to:
20	(1) establish eligibility criteria for educator
21	preparation programs in accordance with Section 56.503 and for
22	scholarship recipients in accordance with Sections 56.504 and
23	<u>56.505;</u>
24	(2) establish procedures for the application process
25	and for selecting scholarship recipients from among eligible
26	applicants; and
27	(3) administer the scholarship program.

(b) In establishing criteria for eligible educator 1 preparation programs under Section 56.503, the coordinating board 2 3 shall consult with the State Board for Educator Certification. The coordinating board shall consider the standards used by the State 4 Board for Educator Certification in identifying effective, 5 high-quality educator preparation programs grounded 6 in 7 evidence-based best practices and, to the maximum extent possible, 8 align the eligibility criteria to those standards. 9 (c) In establishing criteria for eligible persons under Sections 56.504 and 56.505, the coordinating board shall consult 10

10 <u>beechons solver and solves</u>, the coordinating board shall consult 11 with representatives of the educator preparation programs from 12 <u>eligible institutions.</u>

13 (d) In developing rules related to distributing a
14 scholarship, the coordinating board shall consult with financial
15 aid coordinators of eligible institutions.

16 (e) The total amount of scholarships awarded may not exceed 17 the amount available for the program from appropriations, gifts, 18 grants, or other funds.

19 (f) From money appropriated by the legislature for the 20 purposes of this subchapter, the coordinating board annually shall 21 determine the allocation of money available for scholarships among 22 eligible institutions and shall distribute the money accordingly.

23 (g) In determining who should receive a scholarship under 24 this subchapter, the coordinating board shall give priority to 25 awarding scholarships to:

26 <u>(1) persons who demonstrate the greatest financial</u> 27 <u>need and whose expected family contribution, as determined</u>

according to the methodology used for federal student financial 1 aid, does not exceed 60 percent of the average statewide amount of 2 3 tuition and required fees; 4 (2) first-generation college students, as defined by 5 coordinating board rule; and 6 (3) persons who demonstrate a commitment both to 7 entering a teaching field identified by the commissioner of education as experiencing a critical shortage of teachers and to 8 teaching in a public school in this state in which a majority of 9 10 students enrolled are educationally disadvantaged. 11 SECTION 2. Section 56.308(b), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 12 (b) Each school district shall: 13 notify its middle school students, junior high 14 (1)15 school students, and high school students, those students' teachers and school counselors, and those students' parents of the TEXAS 16 17 grant, [and] Teach for Texas grant, and Future Texas Teachers Scholarship programs, the eligibility requirements 18 of each program, the need for students to make informed curriculum choices 19 to be prepared for success beyond high school, and sources of 20

21 information on higher education admissions and financial aid in a 22 manner that assists the district in implementing a strategy adopted 23 by the district under Section 11.252(a)(4); and

(2) ensure that each student's official transcript or
diploma indicates whether the student has completed or is on
schedule to complete:

(A) the recommended or advanced high school

curriculum required for grant eligibility under Section 28.002 or
28.025; or

3 (B) for a school district covered by Section 4 56.304(f)(1), the required portion of the recommended or advanced 5 high school curriculum in the manner described by Section 6 56.304(f)(2).

7 SECTION 3. (a) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating 8 Board shall adopt rules to administer Subchapter S, Chapter 56, 9 Education Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable after 10 the effective date of this Act.

(b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall begin awarding scholarships under Subchapter S, Chapter 56, Beducation Code, as added by this Act, beginning with the 2023-2024 academic year.

15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
