A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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| 2 | relating to a cardiac arrest registry for information on the |
| 3 | incidence and causes of cardiac arrest among certain persons; |
| 4 | providing an administrative penalty. |
| 5 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 6 | SECTION 1. Subtitle D, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is |
| 7 | amended by adding Chapter 93A to read as follows: |
| 8 | CHAPTER 93A. CARDIAC ARREST REGISTRY |
| 9 | Sec. 93A.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: |
| 10 | (1) "Center" means The University of Texas |
| 11 | Southwestern Medical Center. |
| 12 | (2) "Physician" means an individual licensed to |
| 13 | practice medicine in this state. |
| 14 | (3) "Registry" means the cardiac arrest registry |
| 15 | established under this chapter. |
| 16 | Sec. 93A.002. ESTABLISHMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF REGISTRY. |
| 17 | (a) The center shall establish and maintain a cardiac arrest |
| 18 | registry to collect and aggregate information on the incidence and |
| 19 | causes of cardiac arrest among individuals younger than 36 years of |
| 20 | age in this state. |
| 21 | (b) Not later than the 60th day following the date of death |
| 22 | of an individual younger than 36 years of age whose death is caused |
| 23 | by cardiac arrest, the primary physician who attends the |
| 24 | individual's death shall submit to the center for inclusion in the |

- 1 registry information regarding the individual and the death. The
- 2 information must include:
- 3 (1) the age of the individual;
- 4 (2) the time and date of the individual's death;
- 5 (3) a description of the location where and the
- 6 circumstances under which the cardiac arrest occurred;
- 7 (4) a description of the activity in which the
- 8 individual was engaged at the time the cardiac arrest occurred;
- 9 (5) a statement on whether the individual was an
- 10 athlete and if an athlete, each sport the individual participated
- in and the level at which the individual participated in each sport;
- 12 (6) if known by the physician or the individual's
- 13 family, a statement of whether the individual at any time tested
- 14 positive for coronavirus disease (COVID-19); and
- 15 (7) any other information the center determines
- 16 appropriate.
- 17 Sec. 93A.003. PHYSICIAN ACCESS TO REGISTRY; ANNUAL REPORT.
- 18 (a) The center shall ensure that information maintained in the
- 19 registry is accessible to physicians who provide medical care to
- 20 student athletes participating in a sport at any level. The
- 21 information must be aggregated and machine-readable in a manner
- 22 that allows a physician described by this subsection to easily
- 23 navigate the information.
- (b) Not later than September 1 of each even-numbered year,
- 25 the center shall prepare and submit to the legislature a written
- 26 report that summarizes the information submitted to the center for
- 27 inclusion in the registry during the preceding two years.

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- 1 Sec. 93A.004. CONFIDENTIALITY. The center shall ensure
- 2 that information accessible to a physician or submitted to the
- 3 legislature under Section 93A.003 does not disclose an individual's
- 4 personally identifiable information or information that is
- 5 confidential under state or federal law.
- 6 Sec. 93A.005. ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY. (a) The Texas
- 7 Medical Board may assess an administrative penalty against a
- 8 physician who violates Section 93A.002. The administrative penalty
- 9 may not exceed \$500 for each violation and shall be based on:
- 10 (1) the history of previous violations;
- 11 (2) the amount necessary to deter a future violation;
- 12 (3) the efforts to correct the violation; and
- 13 (4) any other matter that justice may require.
- 14 (b) The Texas Medical Board by rule shall establish a
- 15 procedure to collect the administrative penalty. A proceeding to
- 16 impose the administrative penalty is considered a contested case
- 17 under Chapter 2001, Government Code.
- 18 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 19 of this Act, The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center
- 20 shall establish the cardiac arrest registry as required by Chapter
- 21 93A, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
