## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the creation of a Texas Commission on High School
- 3 Outcomes.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "commission" means the
- 6 Texas Commission on High School Outcomes.
- 7 SECTION 2. TEXAS COMMISSION ON HIGH SCHOOL OUTCOMES. (a)
- 8 The commission is established to develop and make recommendations
- 9 for improvements to the current public high school structure or
- 10 practices to improve the college, career, or military readiness of
- 11 students.
- 12 (b) The commission is composed of 16 members, consisting of:
- 13 (1) seven members appointed by the governor;
- 14 (2) four members appointed by the lieutenant governor;
- 15 (3) four members appointed by the speaker of the house
- 16 of representatives; and
- 17 (4) a member of the State Board of Education, as
- 18 designated by the chair of that board.
- 19 (c) The members appointed by the governor must have an
- 20 interest in public education and include at least:
- 21 (1) one person who is a current or retired classroom
- 22 teacher with at least 10 years of teaching experience;
- 23 (2) one person who is a member of the business or civic
- 24 community in North Texas;

- 1 (3) one person who is a member of the business or civic
- 2 community in West Texas; and
- 3 (4) one person who is a member of the business or civic
- 4 community in South Texas.
- 5 (d) The appointments made by the lieutenant governor and the
- 6 speaker of the house of representatives must each consist of:
- 7 (1) three members of the applicable legislative
- 8 chamber; and
- 9 (2) an administrator for a public school or a member of
- 10 the board of trustees of a school district.
- (e) In making appointments under Subsections (b)(1), (2),
- 12 and (3) of this section, the governor, lieutenant governor, and
- 13 speaker of the house of representatives shall coordinate to ensure
- 14 that the membership of the commission reflects, to the extent
- 15 possible, the ethnic and geographic diversity of this state.
- 16 (f) The governor shall designate the presiding officer of
- 17 the commission.
- 18 SECTION 3. COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT. A member of the
- 19 commission is not entitled to compensation for service on the
- 20 commission but is entitled to reimbursement for actual and
- 21 necessary expenses incurred in performing commission duties.
- 22 SECTION 4. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT AND FUNDING. (a) The
- 23 Texas Education Agency shall provide administrative support for the
- 24 commission.
- 25 (b) Funding for the administrative and operational expenses
- 26 of the commission shall be provided by legislative appropriation
- 27 made to the Texas Education Agency for that purpose.

- 1 SECTION 5. STUDY AND RECOMMENDATIONS. (a) The commission
- 2 shall study and develop recommendations under this Act to address
- 3 issues related to the college, career, and military readiness of
- 4 public high school students in this state, including:
- 5 (1) the purpose and role of public high schools in
- 6 preparing students for the modern economy;
- 7 (2) the postsecondary preferences of students and
- 8 young adults and the ways public high schools can be adapted to
- 9 support those preferences;
- 10 (3) changes that could be made to current high school
- 11 graduation requirements to improve student postsecondary outcomes
- 12 and better reflect the needs of the modern economy;
- 13 (4) changes that could be made to the current public
- 14 school finance system to:
- 15 (A) equip and encourage public schools to adopt
- 16 innovative educational models and career and technology programs;
- 17 and
- 18 (B) support the improvement of postsecondary
- 19 outcomes;
- 20 (5) barriers to implementing innovative programs of
- 21 study or courses, including career-focused or technical programs or
- 22 courses, that support students in achieving postsecondary success;
- 23 and
- 24 (6) the state's current approach to industry
- 25 certifications and whether students are being offered credentials
- 26 of value that will lead to high-wage, high-demand jobs.
- 27 (b) The commission may establish one or more working groups

- 1 composed of not more than six members of the commission to study,
- 2 discuss, and address specific policy issues and recommendations to
- 3 refer to the commission for consideration.
- 4 SECTION 6. REPORT. Not later than December 31, 2024, the
- 5 commission shall prepare and deliver a report to the governor and
- 6 the legislature that recommends statutory changes to improve
- 7 outcomes for public high school students and ensure every student
- 8 is prepared for college, a career, or military service immediately
- 9 upon graduation.
- 10 SECTION 7. PUBLIC MEETINGS AND PUBLIC INFORMATION. (a) The
- 11 commission may hold public meetings as needed to fulfill its duties
- 12 under this Act.
- 13 (b) The commission is subject to Chapters 551 and 552,
- 14 Government Code.
- 15 SECTION 8. COMMISSION ABOLISHED. The commission is
- 16 abolished January 1, 2025.
- 17 SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 18 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 19 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 20 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 21 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
