5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 51.931(c), Education Code, is amended to
7	read as follows:
8	(c) If an applicant elects to seek admission under this
9	section, a public institution of higher education:
10	$\underline{(1)}$ $[au]$ in considering the applicant for admission,
11	may [shall] not consider academic course credits or grades earned
12	by the applicant $\underline{\text{five}}$ [$\underline{10}$] or more years $\underline{\text{before}}$ [$\underline{\text{prior to}}$] the
13	starting date of the semester in which the applicant seeks to
14	enroll <u>; and</u>
15	(2) if the institution enrolls the applicant as a
16	student, shall award the applicant academic credit for a number of
17	semester credit hours or the equivalent equal to the lesser of:
18	(A) the number of semester credit hours or the
19	equivalent earned by the applicant during the period described by
20	Subdivision (1); or
21	(B) six semester credit hours or the
22	equivalent. [An applicant who makes the election to apply under
23	this section and is admitted as a student may not receive any course

24 credit for courses undertaken 10 or more years prior to enrollment

1 under this section.

- 2 SECTION 2. Section 61.0595(c), Education Code, is amended
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 (c) For a student enrolled in a baccalaureate program under
- 5 Section 51.931, semester credit hours earned by the student five
- 6 [10] or more years before the date the student begins the new degree
- 7 program under Section 51.931 are not counted for purposes of
- 8 determining whether the student has previously earned the number of
- 9 semester credit hours specified by Subsection (a).
- SECTION 3. Section 51.931(c), Education Code, as amended by
- 11 this Act, applies beginning with admissions to a public institution
- 12 of higher education for the 2023 fall semester.
- SECTION 4. Section 61.0595(c), Education Code, as amended
- 14 by this Act, applies beginning with funding recommendations made
- 15 under Section 61.059, Education Code, for the state fiscal biennium
- 16 beginning September 1, 2025, for semester credit hours earned by
- 17 students enrolling in a baccalaureate degree program at a public
- 18 institution of higher education under Section 51.931, Education
- 19 Code, as added by this Act, for the 2023 fall semester or a
- 20 subsequent semester or term. Funding recommendations for semester
- 21 credit hours earned by a student who enrolled in a baccalaureate
- 22 degree program at a public institution of higher education under
- 23 Section 51.931, Education Code, as amended by this Act, before the
- 24 2023 fall semester are governed by the law in effect immediately
- 25 before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is
- 26 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 27 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
