## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to conducting certain medical examinations using
- 3 telemedicine under the workers' compensation system.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 408.0041, Labor Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsection (d-1) to read as follows:
- 7 (d-1) In this subsection, "telehealth services" and
- 8 "telemedicine medical services" have the meanings assigned by
- 9 Section 111.001, Occupations Code. The commissioner may order an
- 10 examination under this section to be conducted using telehealth
- 11 services or telemedicine medical services if the commissioner
- 12 determines conducting the examination in that manner is necessary
- 13 to ensure access to a timely examination by a qualified doctor.
- 14 During an examination conducted using telehealth services or
- 15 telemedicine medical services under this subsection, a health care
- 16 professional must be physically present in the room in which the
- 17 employee is located to assist in conducting the examination and
- 18 administering any necessary testing. The commissioner may adopt
- 19 rules related to examinations performed using telehealth services
- 20 or telemedicine medical services under this subsection.
- 21 SECTION 2. Subchapter G, Chapter 408, Labor Code, is
- 22 amended by adding Section 408.1231 to read as follows:
- Sec. 408.1231. CONDUCTING CERTAIN MEDICAL EXAMINATIONS
- 24 USING TELEHEALTH SERVICES OR TELEMEDICINE MEDICAL SERVICES. (a)

- 1 In this section, "telehealth services" and "telemedicine medical
- 2 services" have the meanings assigned by Section 111.001,
- 3 Occupations Code.
- 4 (b) The employee's treating doctor or another doctor
- 5 authorized by the division to certify maximum medical improvement
- 6 or assign an impairment rating under Section 408.123 may certify
- 7 maximum medical improvement or assign an impairment rating during a
- 8 medical examination performed by the doctor using telehealth
- 9 services or telemedicine medical services if:
- 10 (1) the examination is of a musculoskeletal injury or
- 11 diagnosis involving:
- 12 (A) the hand or upper extremities;
- 13 (B) the foot, including toes and heel; or
- 14 (C) the spine and musculoskeletal structures of
- 15 the torso; or
- 16 (2) the commissioner determines there is good cause to
- 17 conduct the examination using telehealth services or telemedicine
- 18 medical services.
- 19 (c) During an examination conducted using telehealth
- 20 services or telemedicine medical services under Subsection (b), a
- 21 health care professional must be physically present in the room in
- 22 which the employee is located to assist in conducting the
- 23 examination and administering any necessary testing unless a
- 24 doctor:
- 25 (1) determined that the employee is not at maximum
- 26 medical improvement; or
- 27 (2) certified maximum medical improvement during an

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- 1 examination and based on the examination concluded there was no
- 2 possibility of impairment.
- 3 <u>(d) The commissioner shall adopt rules necessary to</u>
- 4 implement this section.
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 408.0041, Labor Code, as amended by this
- 6 Act, and Section 408.1231, Labor Code, as added by this Act, apply
- 7 only to a medical examination conducted on or after the effective
- 8 date of this Act. A medical examination conducted before that date
- 9 is governed by the law in effect on the date the examination was
- 10 conducted, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 11 purpose.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect January 1, 2024.
