## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to conducting certain medical examinations using telemedicine under the workers' compensation system. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 408.123, Labor Code, is amended by 5 adding Subsections (i) and (j) to read as follows: 6 (i) A medical examination conducted to certify maximum 7 medical improvement or assign an impairment rating may be performed 8 9 using telehealth services or telemedicine medical services, as defined by Section 111.001, Occupations Code. Except as provided 10 by Subsection (j), a health care professional must be physically 11 present in the room in which the employee is located to assist the 12 certifying doctor in conducting the examination and administering 13 14 any necessary testing. For purposes of this subsection, "health care professional" means an individual licensed, certified, or 15 16 otherwise authorized to administer health care, for profit or otherwise, in the ordinary course of business or professional 17 18 practice. (j) A health care professional is not required to be 19 physically present in the room in which the patient is located 20 during a medical examination performed using telehealth services or 21 telemedicine medical services as provided by Subsection (i) that is 22 23 conducted to assign an impairment rating if: 24 (1) a doctor certified maximum medical improvement

## 1 during an examination; and

## 2 (2) based on the examination described by Subdivision 3 (1), the doctor concluded there was no possibility of impairment.

4 SECTION 2. Sections 408.123(i) and (j), Labor Code, as added by this Act, apply only to a medical examination to certify an 5 6 employee's maximum medical improvement or assign an employee's impairment rating conducted on or after the effective date of this 7 Act. A medical examination conducted before the effective date of 8 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the 9 examination was conducted, and the former law is continued in 10 effect for that purpose. 11
