- 4 (H) the entirety of Martin Luther King Jr.'s

- 6 (h-6) In providing instruction regarding the founding
- 7 documents of the United States as described by Subsection (h-1)(5)
- 8  $[\frac{(h-1)(4)}{4}]$ , a school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 9 shall use those documents as part of the instructional materials
- 10 for the instruction.
- SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 12 school year.
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
