| 4 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 5 | SECTION 1. Sec. 772, GOVERNMENT CODE, Is amended by adding |
| 6 | 772.0065 to read as follows: (a) In this section: |
| 7 | (1) "Task force" means the Lethal Poisoning Prevention |
| 8 | Task Force. |
| 9 | (2) "Lethal Poison" means any substance consisting |
| 10 | wholly or partly of a substance listed in Section 481.1022 of the |
| 11 | Health and Safety Code. |
| 12 | (b) The governor shall establish the Lethal Poisoning |
| 13 | Prevention Task Force that will consist of two members from: |
| 14 | (1) the Department of Public Safety; |
| 15 | (2) the Health and Human Services Commission; and |
| 16 | (3) the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement. |
| 17 | (c) The task force shall: |
| 18 | (1) compile data on criminal activity in the Texas - |
| 19 | Mexico border region relating to the manufacturing, trafficking, |
| 20 | and delivery of lethal poison; and |
| 21 | (2) develop best practices for: |
| 22 | (A) the investigation, interdiction, and |
| 23 | prosecution of criminal activity relating to the manufacturing and |
| 24 | delivery of lethal poison; and |

| 3 | (d) The task force shall submit the final report no later |
| 4 | than 6 months after the date of its formation. |
| 5 | (e) The task force shall submit the final report to: |
| 6 | (1) the office of the Governor; and |
| 7 | (2) the Texas Department of Public Safety. |
| 8 | SECTION 2. Sec. 411, GOVERNMENT CODE, Is amended by adding |
| 9 | Section 411.02071 to read as follows: |
| 10 | Sec. 411.02072. LETHAL POISONING PREVENTION TRAINING |
| 11 | PROGRAM. (a) The department, in coordination with local law |
| 12 | enforcement agencies, shall establish and administer a lethal |
| 13 | poisoning prevention training program for peace officers employed |
| 14 | by local law enforcement agencies that will prepare officers to: |
| 15 | (1) collaborate and cooperate with and assist any law |
| 16 | enforcement agency in the interdiction, investigation, and |
| 17 | prosecution of criminal activity relating to the manufacturing and |
| 18 | delivery of lethal poisons consisting wholly or partly of a |
| 19 | substance listed in section 481.1022, Health and Safety code; and |
| 20 | (2) collaborate and cooperate with and assist district |
| 21 | attorneys, county attorneys, the border prosecution unit, and other |
| 22 | prosecutors in the investigation and prosecution of allegations of |

(c) The department shall identify opportunities for a peace 16 17 officer described by Subsection (a) to assist in the department's duties relating to the interdiction of lethal poison consisting 18 19 either wholly or partly of a substance listed in section 481.1022, Health and Safety Code. 20 21 (d) A peace officer authorized by the department to assist in carrying out duties related to the department's border 22 operations as described by Subsection (c) is not entitled to 23 24 compensation from the department for the assistance provided. SECTION 3. Subchapter H, Chapter 1701, GOVERNMENT CODE, is 25 26 amended by adding Sec. 1701.359A to read as follows: 27 Sec. 1701.359A. LETHAL POISONING PREVENTION TRAINING

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| 1 | PROGRAM. (a) The commission may: |
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| 2 | (1) recognize, or with the consent of the Department |
| 3 | of Public Safety, administer or assist in administering the lethal |
| 4 | poisoning prevention program established under Section 411.02071, |
| 5 | Government Code, as a continuing education program for officers; |

| 7 | (2) credit an officer who successfully completes the |
| 8 | program described by Subdivision (1) with the appropriate number of |
| 9 | continuing education hours. |
| 10 | SECTION 4. Sec. 19, Penal Code, is amended by adding section |
| 11 | 19.07, LETHAL POISONING to read as follows: |
| 12 | (a) An individual commits an offense under this section if: |
| 13 | (1) they manufacture, deliver, or traffic a lethal |
| 14 | poison consisting wholly or partly of a substance listed under |
| 15 | Section 481.1022 of the Health and Safety Code and an individual |
| 16 | dies as a result of injecting, ingesting, or introducing into the |
| 17 | individuals body any amount of the substance listed in 481.1022 |
| 18 | that was manufactured, delivered, or trafficked by the actor |
| 19 | whether the lethal poison was used by itself or with any other |
| 20 | substance. |
| 21 | (b) This penalty does not apply if the actor's conduct in |
| 22 | manufacturing or delivering the controlled substance was |
| 23 | authorized under chapter 481 of the Health and Safety Code. |
| 24 | SECTION 5. This act takes effect September 1, 2023. |

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
