## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the imposition of administrative, civil, and criminal penalties for violating certain statutes under the jurisdiction of, 3 rules or orders adopted by, or licenses, permits, or certificates 4 5 issued by the Railroad Commission of Texas; increasing criminal penalties. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 7 SECTION 1. Sections 81.0531(b), (c), and (d), Natural 8 9 Resources Code, are amended to read as follows: (b) The penalty may not exceed: 10 11 (1)\$25,000 [ \$10,000 ] a day for each violation that is 12 not related to pipeline safety; or \$200,000 a day for each violation that is related 13 (2) 14 to pipeline safety. In determining the amount of the penalty, the commission 15 (c) 16 shall consider the [permittee's history of previous violations, the 17 seriousness of the violation, any hazard to the health or safety of the public, and the demonstrated good faith of the person charged. 18 In determining the amount of the penalty for a violation of a 19 provision of this title or a rule, order, license, permit, or 20 certificate that relates to pipeline safety, the commission shall 21 consider the] guidelines adopted under Subsection (d). 22 23 (d) The commission [by rule] shall adopt guidelines to be used in determining the amount of the penalty. The commission shall 24

No. 4786 provide an opportunity for public input on the guidelines [for a 1 violation of a provision of this title or a rule, order, license, 2 permit, or certificate that relates to pipeline safety]. 3 The guidelines must [shall] include a penalty calculation worksheet 4 5 that specifies the typical penalty for certain violations, circumstances justifying enhancement of a penalty and the amount of 6 the enhancement, and circumstances justifying a reduction in a 7 8 penalty and the amount of the reduction. The guidelines must provide for different penalties for different violations based on 9 the seriousness of the violation and any hazard to the health or 10 safety of the public resulting from the violation. The guidelines 11 12 must [shall] take into account: (1) the permittee's history of previous violations, 13 14 including the number of previous violations; (2) the seriousness of the violation and of any 15 pollution resulting from the violation; 16 17 (3) any hazard to the health or safety of the public; the degree of culpability; 18 (4) 19 (5) the demonstrated good faith of the person charged; [and] 20 21 (6) the number of times the permittee's certificate of compliance issued under Subchapter P, Chapter 91, has been 22 canceled; 23 24 (7) any economic benefit gained through the violation; 25 (8) the penalty necessary to deter future violations; 26 and factor the 27 (9) any other commission considers

2 SECTION 2. Section 81.058(d), Natural Resources Code, is 3 amended to read as follows:

(d) An administrative penalty imposed under this section
may not exceed \$25,000 [\$5,000] a day for each violation. Each day
a violation continues or occurs is a separate violation for
purposes of imposing a penalty under this section.

8 SECTION 3. Section 91.002(b), Natural Resources Code, is 9 amended to read as follows:

10 (b) An offense under Subsection (a) of this section is 11 punishable by a fine of not more than <u>\$25,000</u> [<del>\$10,000</del>] a day for 12 each day a violation is committed.

13 SECTION 4. Section 27.101(a), Water Code, is amended to 14 read as follows:

15 (a) A person who violates any provision of this chapter under the jurisdiction of the railroad commission, any rule of the 16 17 railroad commission made under this chapter, or any term, condition, or provision of a permit issued by the railroad 18 commission under this chapter shall be subject to a civil penalty in 19 any sum not exceeding \$25,000 [<del>\$5,000</del>] for each day of 20 noncompliance and for each act of noncompliance. A violation under 21 the jurisdiction of the commission is enforceable as provided by 22 23 Chapter 7.

24 SECTION 5. Section 27.1011(b), Water Code, is amended to 25 read as follows:

(b) The penalty may not exceed <u>\$25,000</u> [<del>\$10,000</del>] a day for
each violation. Each day a violation continues may be considered a

1 separate violation for purposes of penalty assessments.

2 SECTION 6. Section 27.105(a), Water Code, is amended to 3 read as follows:

4 (a) A person who knowingly or intentionally violates a 5 provision of this chapter under the jurisdiction of the railroad commission, a rule of the railroad commission, or a term, 6 condition, or provision of a permit issued by the railroad 7 8 commission under this chapter is subject to a fine of not more than \$25,000 [<del>\$5,000</del>] for each violation and for each day of violation. 9 A violation under the jurisdiction of the commission is enforceable 10 under Section 7.157. 11

SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 12 a violation committed on or after the effective date of this Act. A 13 violation committed before the effective date of this Act is 14 15 governed by the law in effect when the violation was committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 16 For purposes of this section, a violation was committed before the 17 effective date of this Act if any element of the violation was 18 committed before that date. 19
