	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to establishing the Texas Carbon Emissions Mitigation and
3	Severe Weather Adaptation Commission to study and address the
4	impacts of carbon emissions and severe weather in this state.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the Texas Carbon
7	Emissions Mitigation and Severe Weather Adaptation Act.
8	SECTION 2. Subtitle C, Title 5, Health and Safety Code, is
9	amended by adding Chapter 396 to read as follows:
10	CHAPTER 396. TEXAS CARBON EMISSIONS MITIGATION AND SEVERE WEATHER
11	ADAPTATION COMMISSION
12	Sec. 396.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
13	(1) "Commission" means the Texas Carbon Emissions
14	Mitigation and Severe Weather Adaptation Commission.
15	(2) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning
16	assigned by Section 61.003, Education Code.
17	Sec. 396.002. LIBERAL CONSTRUCTION. This chapter shall be
18	liberally construed to minimize future risk to the residents and
19	environment of this state.
20	Sec. 396.003. COMMISSION CREATED; COMPOSITION. (a) The
21	Texas Carbon Emissions Mitigation and Severe Weather Adaptation
22	Commission is created.
23	(b) The commission is composed of:
24	(1) one member appointed by the governor;

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1	(2) one member appointed by the lieutenant governor;
2	(3) one member appointed by the governor from a list of
3	names submitted by the speaker of the house of representatives;
4	(4) one member appointed by the governor from a list of
5	names submitted by the most senior member of the minority party of
6	the house of representatives;
7	(5) one member appointed by the governor from a list of
8	names submitted by the most senior member of the minority party of
9	the senate; and
10	(6) the following members of which two-thirds are
11	appointed evenly between the governor and the lieutenant governor,
12	and the remaining one-third are appointed by the governor from a
13	list of names submitted by the speaker of the house of
14	representatives:
15	(A) a representative of the public energy sector;
16	(B) a representative of rural electric
17	<pre>cooperatives;</pre>
18	(C) a representative of the municipal
19	electricity sector;
20	(D) two representatives of separate nonprofit
21	environmental organizations;
22	(E) three scientists at separate institutions of
23	higher education, including one climatologist;
24	(F) an economist from an institution of higher
25	education;
26	(G) a representative of business and industry;
27	(H) a representative of the manufacturing or

1	<u>mining industry;</u>
2	(I) a representative of the agriculture or
3	forestry industry;
4	(J) a representative of the fossil fuel industry;
5	(K) a representative from the Health and Human
6	Services Commission;
7	(L) a representative from the Texas Military
8	Preparedness Commission;
9	(M) a representative from the Texas Division of
10	Emergency Management;
11	(N) a representative from the Texas Water
12	Development Board; and
13	(O) three representatives of the public.
14	(c) In addition to the members listed in Subsection (b), the
15	chairs of the commission may request the participation or input of
16	other individuals as the chairs determine is necessary, including:
17	(1) other members of the public;
18	(2) individuals with expertise in the area of carbon
19	emissions mitigation and severe weather adaptation; and
20	(3) local, state, and federal officials involved in
21	carbon emissions mitigation and severe weather adaptation
22	planning.
23	Sec. 396.004. JOINT CHAIRS; MEETINGS; COMPENSATION. (a)
24	The commission shall elect two of the commission's members to serve
25	as joint chairs of the commission.
26	(b) The commission shall meet at the call of either joint
27	<u>chair.</u>

(c) A commission member is not entitled to receive 1 2 compensation for service on the commission but is entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses, including travel 3 expenses, incurred by the member in performing commission duties. 4 Sec. 396.005. TERMS; VACANCY. (a) 5 Members of the 6 commission serve staggered six-year terms, with eight or nine 7 members' terms expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered year. 8 (b) A vacancy on the commission shall be filled in the same 9 manner as the original appointment. 10 Sec. 396.006. ACTIVITIES OF COMMISSION. (a) The commission shall: 11 12 (1) establish carbon emissions mitigation and severe weather adaptation strategies, including goals to help guide 13 14 planning and statewide implementation of the strategies, using the 15 latest and best available scientific analysis, risk assessment tools, and other information the commission considers necessary to 16 17 monitor and forecast the impact of carbon emissions and severe weather at the state, regional, and local levels; 18 (2) provide policy direction, facilitation, 19 coordination, and planning to federal, state, and local agencies, 20 21 and other persons as appropriate; 22 (3) identify: 23 (A) persons, communities, industries, and 24 ecosystems of this state vulnerable to impacts related to carbon 25 emissions and severe weather; (B) potential economic ramifications of impacts 26 related to carbon emissions and severe weather; and 27

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1	(C) existing carbon emissions mitigation and
2	severe weather adaptation efforts at the federal, state, and local
3	levels;
4	(4) make recommendations for meeting or exceeding this
5	state's carbon emissions mitigation and severe weather adaptation
6	goals established by the commission;
7	(5) assess the capacity and availability of existing
8	resources and identify new sources of revenue necessary to address
9	carbon emissions mitigation and severe weather adaptation; and
10	(6) advise the governor, legislature, and local
11	governments of this state on the economic and budgetary
12	ramifications of carbon emissions and severe weather impacts,
13	mitigation, and adaptation.
14	(b) The commission may confer with scientists and other
15	experts to evaluate whether more frequent or extreme winter cold
16	snaps are caused by the warming of the stratospheric polar vortex as
17	a result of carbon emissions.
18	Sec. 396.007. INTERNET WEBSITE. The commission shall
19	develop and maintain an Internet website that:
20	(1) includes a mission statement relating to the
21	duties and goals of the commission under this chapter; and
22	(2) describes the actions, plans, and policies of the
23	commission, and the results, if any, of such actions, plans, and
24	policies.
25	Sec. 396.008. BIENNIAL PROGRESS REPORT. The commission
26	shall identify the information necessary to track this state's
27	progress in implementing the carbon emissions mitigation and severe

1 weather adaptation strategies established by the commission under Section 396.006 and shall submit a biennial progress report to the 2 governor and the legislature not later than the 20th day before the 3 date each regular session of the legislature convenes. 4 5 Sec. 396.009. COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW; REPORT. Not later than the 20th day before the date the regular session of the 90th 6 7 Legislature convenes, and before the end of each successive five-year period after that date, the commission shall conduct a 8 comprehensive review of the statewide implementation of the carbon 9 emissions mitigation and severe weather adaptation strategies 10 established by the commission under Section 396.006 and submit a 11 12 report on the commission's findings and recommendations to the governor, the legislature, and the governing body of each 13 14 municipality and county in this state. Sec. 396.010. SEA LEVEL RISE VULNERABILITY AND ADAPTATION 15 REPORT. (a) The commission shall develop and make publicly 16 17 available a sea level rise vulnerability and adaptation report that identifies: 18 19 (1) the major areas of this state that are or will be impacted by sea level rise during the next 30 years; 20 21 (2) the sea level rise impacts reasonably expected to occur during the next 30 years in each area identified under 22 Subdivision (1), based on the latest and best available scientific 23 24 research; 25 (3) the economic ramifications of sea level rise; and 26 (4) applicable federal laws, policies, and programs affecting areas of this state impacted by sea level rise. 27

H.B. No. 4792 (b) The report developed under Subsection (a) must include 1 the commission's recommendations for planning, management, and 2 adaptation relating to hazards associated with sea level rise. 3 4 (c) In developing the report under Subsection (a), the 5 commission shall: 6 (1) solicit public comment; and 7 (2) coordinate with the federal, state, and local 8 agencies involved in carbon emissions mitigation and severe weather adaptation planning. 9 (d) The commission shall evaluate and update the sea level 10 rise vulnerability and adaptation report developed under this 11 12 section at least once every five years. SECTION 3. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective 13 14 date of this Act: 15 (1) the governor and lieutenant governor shall appoint 16 the 25 members to the Texas Carbon Emissions Mitigation and Severe 17 Weather Adaptation Commission as provided by Section 396.003, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act; and 18 19 (2) the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives or their designees shall meet to 20 apportion the appointments under Section 396.003(b)(6), Health and 21 Safety Code, as added by this Act. 22 The initial members of the Texas Carbon Emissions 23 (b) 24 Mitigation and Severe Weather Adaptation Commission appointed under this section shall draw lots to determine which members will 25 serve terms expiring February 1, 2025, which members will serve 26 terms expiring February 1, 2027, and which members will serve terms 27

1 expiring February 1, 2029.

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SECTION 4. Not later than September 30, 2024, the Texas Carbon Emissions Mitigation and Severe Weather Adaptation Commission shall develop and make publicly available the initial sea level rise vulnerability and adaptation report required by Section 396.010, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
