A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the development of a severe weather adaptation plan by
3	certain entities.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 5, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 393 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 393. SEVERE WEATHER PLAN
8	Sec. 393.001. PARTICIPATING ENTITIES. Not later than
9	September 1 of each even-numbered year, each of the following
10	entities shall publish a severe weather adaptation plan that will
11	assess the entity's role with respect to severe weather:
12	(1) the Texas Division of Emergency Management;
13	(2) the Department of Agriculture;
14	(3) the independent organization certified under
15	Section 39.151, Utilities Code;
16	(4) the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality;
17	(5) the General Land Office;
18	(6) the Health and Human Services Commission;
19	(7) the Texas Department of Housing and Community
20	Affairs;
21	(8) the Texas Department of Insurance;
22	(9) the Parks and Wildlife Department;
23	(10) the Department of Public Safety of the State of
24	Texas;

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1	(11) the Public Utility Commission of Texas;
2	(12 the office of the comptroller;
3	(13) the Texas Department of Transportation;
4	(14) the Texas Forest Service; and
5	(15) the Texas Water Development Board.
6	Sec. 393.002. PLAN. (a) For the purposes of this chapter,
7	a severe weather adaptation plan is a strategy to identify,
8	minimize, and adequately prepare for the effects of increased
9	incidence and prevalence of severe weather on the social, economic,
10	and ecological systems of this state and to manage the risks
11	associated severe weather. A plan under this section must be based
12	on current research-based science that identifies the likely
13	impacts of extreme weather events on this state.
14	(b) Each severe weather adaptation plan must include:
15	(1) a severe weather vulnerability assessment;
16	(2) a review of existing programs in the context of
17	anticipated severe weather conditions;
18	(3) specific steps necessary for the entity to fulfill
19	its mission during the anticipated severe weather event;
20	(4) an analysis of the effects implementing the steps
21	identified under Subdivision (3) would have on the entity's budget
22	during the next 2, 5, and 10 years;
23	(5) potential sources of funding to support the
24	entity's efforts to adapt to increased prevalence of severe
25	weather; and
26	(6) a statewide strategy to monitor the continuing
	effects of severe weather events
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- (c) In developing a severe weather adaptation plan, each
- 2 entity subject to this section shall:
- 3 (1) consult with the Houston Advanced Research Center;
- 4 and
- 5 (2) consult with the Office of the Texas State
- 6 Climatologist in the Department of Atmospheric Sciences, College of
- 7 Geosciences, Texas A&M University.
- 8 (d) Not later than September 1 of each even-numbered year,
- 9 each entity subject to this section shall post the entity's severe
- 10 weather adaptation plan on a publicly accessible Internet website
- 11 and electronically submit a copy of the plan to:
- 12 (1) the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of
- 13 the house of representatives;
- 14 (2) the presiding officer of each standing committee
- 15 or subcommittee of the legislature with primary jurisdiction over
- 16 <u>environmental matters; and</u>
- 17 (3) the executive director of the Texas Commission on
- 18 Environmental Quality.
- 19 (e) Each severe weather adaptation plan is subject to audit
- 20 by the state auditor in accordance with Chapter 321, Government
- 21 <u>Code</u>.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
