A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the authority of a local government to regulate
3	evictions.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 250, Local Government Code, is amended
6	by adding Section 250.011 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 250.011. AUTHORITY OF LOCAL GOVERNMENTS TO REGULATE
8	EVICTIONS. Notwithstanding any other law, a municipality or county
9	may not adopt or enforce an ordinance, order, or other measure that:
10	(1) prohibits, restricts, or delays:
11	(A) delivery of a notice to vacate; or
12	(B) filing of a suit to recover possession of the
13	premises under Chapter 24 of the Property Code; or
14	(2) otherwise relates to an eviction suit.
15	SECTION 2. Section 24.005(e), Property Code, is amended to
16	read as follows:
17	(e) If the lease or applicable <u>federal</u> law requires the
18	landlord to give a tenant an opportunity to respond to a notice of
19	proposed eviction, a notice to vacate may not be given until the
20	period provided for the tenant to respond to the eviction notice has
21	expired.
22	SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
23	an eviction suit in which the notice to vacate is given on or after

24 the effective date of this Act. An eviction suit in which the

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- 1 notice to vacate is given before the effective date of this Act is
- 2 governed by the law as it existed immediately before the effective
- 3 date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that
- 4 purpose.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
