## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the provision of acupuncture services by a chiropractor
- 3 under a certificate issued by the Texas Board of Chiropractic
- 4 Examiners.

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 201.002(a)(3), Occupations Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (3) "Incisive or surgical procedure" includes making
- 9 an incision into any tissue, cavity, or organ by any person or
- 10 implement. The term does not include the use of:
- 11 (A) a needle for the purpose of drawing blood for
- 12 diagnostic testing; or
- 13 (B) an acupuncture needle for the purpose of
- 14 treating a condition within the scope of practice of chiropractic.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 201.356, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 16 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 17 <u>(a-1)</u> As part of the minimum number of hours of continuing
- 18 education required to renew a license, the board shall require a
- 19 license holder who is authorized to provide acupuncture services
- 20 under Section 201.454 to complete not less than eight hours of
- 21 continuing education relating to acupuncture.
- SECTION 3. Subchapter J, Chapter 201, Occupations Code, is
- 23 amended by adding Section 201.454 to read as follows:
- Sec. 201.454. ACUPUNCTURE SERVICES CERTIFICATE. The board

- 1 shall issue a certificate authorizing a chiropractor to provide
- 2 acupuncture services for a condition within the scope of practice
- 3 of chiropractic if the chiropractor submits proof to the board that
- 4 the chiropractor has completed not less than 100 hours of didactic
- 5 and practical training in the use and administration of
- 6 acupuncture, as determined by board rule, as part of a bona fide
- 7 reputable doctor of chiropractic degree program or at an
- 8 acupuncture school approved by the Texas State Board of Acupuncture
- 9 Examiners.
- SECTION 4. Section 201.502, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 11 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as
- 12 follows:
- 13 (a) The board may refuse to admit a person to examinations
- 14 and may revoke or suspend a license or place a license holder on
- 15 probation for a period determined by the board for:
- 16 (1) violating this chapter or a rule adopted under
- 17 this chapter, including committing an act prohibited under Section
- 18 201.5025;
- 19 (2) engaging in deception or fraud in the practice of
- 20 chiropractic;
- 21 (3) presenting to the board or using a license,
- 22 certificate, or diploma or a transcript of a license, certificate,
- 23 or diploma that was illegally or fraudulently obtained,
- 24 counterfeited, or materially altered;
- 25 (4) presenting to the board an untrue statement or a
- 26 document or testimony that was illegally used to pass the
- 27 examination;

- 1 (5) being convicted of a crime involving moral
- 2 turpitude or a felony;
- 3 (6) procuring or assisting in the procuring of an
- 4 abortion;
- 5 (7) engaging in grossly unprofessional conduct or
- 6 dishonorable conduct of a character likely to deceive or defraud
- 7 the public;
- 8 (8) having a habit of intemperance or drug addiction
- 9 or another habit that, in the opinion of the board, endangers the
- 10 life of a patient;
- 11 (9) using an advertising statement that is false or
- 12 that tends to mislead or deceive the public;
- 13 (10) directly or indirectly employing or associating
- 14 with a person who, in the course of the person's employment, commits
- 15 an act constituting the practice of chiropractic when the person is
- 16 not licensed to practice chiropractic;
- 17 (11) advertising professional superiority, or
- 18 advertising the performance of professional services in a superior
- 19 manner, if that advertising is not readily subject to verification;
- 20 (12) purchasing, selling, bartering, using, or
- 21 offering to purchase, sell, barter, or use a chiropractic degree,
- 22 license, certificate, or diploma or transcript of a license,
- 23 certificate, or diploma in or relating to an application to the
- 24 board for a license to practice chiropractic;
- 25 (13) altering with fraudulent intent a chiropractic
- 26 license, certificate, or diploma or transcript of a chiropractic
- 27 license, certificate, or diploma;

- 1 (14) impersonating or acting as proxy for another in
- 2 an examination required by this chapter for a chiropractic license;
- 3 (15) impersonating a licensed chiropractor;
- 4 (16) allowing one's chiropractic license to be used by
- 5 another person to practice chiropractic;
- 6 (17) being proved insane by a person having authority
- 7 to make that determination;
- 8 (18) failing to use proper diligence in the practice
- 9 of chiropractic or using gross inefficiency in the practice of
- 10 chiropractic;
- 11 (19) failing to clearly differentiate a chiropractic
- 12 office or clinic from another business or enterprise;
- 13 (20) personally soliciting a patient or causing a
- 14 patient to be solicited by the use of a case history of another
- 15 patient of another chiropractor;
- 16 (21) using for the purpose of soliciting patients an
- 17 accident report prepared by a peace officer in a manner prohibited
- 18 by Section 38.12, Penal Code;
- 19 (22) advertising using the term "physician" or
- 20 "chiropractic physician" or any combination or derivation of the
- 21 term "physician"; [<del>or</del>]
- 22 (23) advertising in a manner that implies the license
- 23 holder is authorized to offer the full range of acupuncture
- 24 treatments or services as a person licensed under Chapter 205,
- 25 including advertising using the terms or phrases "acupuncturist,"
- 26 "licensed acupuncturist," "L.Ac.," "traditional Chinese medicine,"
- 27 "degreed in acupuncture," or "Board Certified in Acupuncture"; or

- 1 (24) failing to submit fingerprints to the board or
- 2 Department of Public Safety to enable the board to obtain criminal
- 3 history record information as required by Section 201.313.
- 4 (b-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (a)(23), a license holder
- 5 may use the phrase "Board Certified in Chiropractic Acupuncture" if
- 6 the license holder is certified to provide acupuncture services
- 7 under Section 201.454.
- 8 SECTION 5. The Texas Board of Chiropractic Examiners shall
- 9 issue a certificate under Section 201.454, Occupations Code, as
- 10 added by this Act, to a chiropractor who:
- 11 (1) applies to the board for the issuance of the
- 12 certificate on or before September 1, 2024;
- 13 (2) as of August 31, 2023, was authorized to provide
- 14 acupuncture services under board rules in existence on that date;
- 15 and
- 16 (3) submits to the board proof of completion of the
- 17 training required by board rules described by Subdivision (2) of
- 18 this section.
- 19 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
