## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to disclosure under the public information law of settlement communications maintained by or on behalf of the 3 attorney general as part of a deceptive trade practices 4 5 investigation or action. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 7 SECTION 1. Section 17.45, Business & Commerce Code, is amended by adding Subdivision (18) to read as follows: 8 (18) "Settlement communications" means documentary 9 materials or information collected, assembled, drafted, developed, 10 used, received, or maintained by or on behalf of the attorney 11 general with respect to an investigation or litigation conducted 12 under this subchapter and that reflects or is regarding 13 14 negotiations made for the purpose of achieving a resolution of a matter without the need for continuing with litigation or trial. 15 SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 17, Business & Commerce 16 17 Code, is amended by adding Section 17.475 to read as follows: 18 Sec. 17.475. CONFIDENTIALITY OF SETTLEMENT COMMUNICATIONS. An attorney general settlement communication is privileged and not 19 subject to disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code, from the 20 date the attorney general's investigation begins, as indicated in 21 the attorney general's case management records, until the earlier 22 23 of the date: 24 (1) the case is reported closed in the attorney

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1	general's case management records;
2	(2) the final judgment, assurance of voluntary
3	compliance, or other settlement agreement is entered by the court,
4	and the period for filing a notice of appeal has passed;
5	(3) the settlement documents are executed by all
6	parties, if the documents are not filed in court;
7	(4) the order of dismissal or nonsuit disposing of all
8	parties is entered by the court; or
9	(5) all appeals are finalized.
10	SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
11	to a request for public information received by the attorney
12	general under Chapter 552, Government Code, on or after the
13	effective date of this Act.
14	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
