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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to public school cybersecurity controls and requirements and technical assistance and cybersecurity risk assessments for 3 public schools provided by the Department of Information Resources. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Section 11.175(c), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 (c) A school district's cybersecurity policy <u>must comply</u> 8 9 with the cybersecurity controls and requirements adopted by the commissioner under Section 32.351 and may not conflict with the 10 11 information security standards for institutions of higher 12 education adopted by the Department of Information Resources under Chapters 2054 and 2059, Government Code. 13 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 32, Education Code, is amended by adding Subchapter H to read as follows: 15 16 SUBCHAPTER H. CYBERSECURITY Sec. 32.351. CYBERSECURITY CONTROLS AND REQUIREMENTS. (a) 17 The commissioner shall adopt cybersecurity controls and 18 19 requirements for school districts, open-enrollment charter schools, and district and school vendors in consultation with and 20 21 as recommended by the Department of Information Resources. 22 (b) Each school district and open-enrollment charter school 23 shall implement the cybersecurity controls and requirements 24 adopted by the commissioner under this section.

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1	(c) To implement this section, the agency may contract with:
2	(1) a regional education service center;
3	(2) a private entity; or
4	(3) a regional network security center under
5	Subchapter E, Chapter 2059, Government Code.
6	(d) The commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to
7	implement this section.
8	(e) Not later than September 1 of each even-numbered year,
9	the commissioner shall review the rules adopted under this section
10	and amend the rules as necessary to ensure that the cybersecurity
11	controls and requirements continue to provide effective
12	cybersecurity protection for school districts and open-enrollment
13	charter schools.
14	SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 2054, Government Code, is
15	amended by adding Sections 2054.0561 and 2054.0595 to read as
16	follows:
17	Sec. 2054.0561. TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS.
18	(a) The department may provide technical assistance to school
19	districts and open-enrollment charter schools regarding the
20	implementation of cybersecurity controls, requirements, and
21	network operations under Sections 11.175 and 32.351, Education
22	Code. In providing technical assistance to districts and schools,
23	the department may:
24	(1) use services offered by third parties;
25	(2) procure technology and services for districts and
26	<pre>schools;</pre>
27	(3) recommend to the Legislative Budget Board that

school districts and open-enrollment charter schools migrate 1 services to the State Data Center located on the campus of Angelo 2 3 State University; and 4 (4) use the services of a regional network security 5 center established under Section 2059.202. 6 (b) The department may adopt rules as necessary to implement 7 this section. 8 Sec. 2054.0595. CYBERSECURITY RISK ASSESSMENTS FOR PUBLIC The department may perform a cybersecurity risk 9 SCHOOLS. 10 assessment of a school district or open-enrollment charter school at the request of: 11 12 (1) the commissioner of the Texas Education Agency; (2) the superintendent of the district or the person 13 14 who serves the function of superintendent of the school, as 15 applicable; or 16 (3) the Texas Division of Emergency Management after a 17 cybersecurity incident affecting the district or school. SECTION 4. Section 2059.058(b), Government Code, is amended 18 to read as follows: 19 In addition to the department's duty to provide network 20 (b) security services to state agencies under this chapter, the 21 department by agreement may provide network security to: 22 23 (1)each house of the legislature; 24 (2) an agency that is not a state agency, including a 25 legislative agency; 26 (3) a political subdivision of this state, including a

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county, municipality, or special district;

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(4) an independent organization, as defined by Section
 39.151, Utilities Code; [and]

3 (5) a public junior college; and

4 (6) an open-enrollment charter school established
5 under Subchapter D, Chapter 12, Education Code.

6 SECTION 5. Section 2059.201, Government Code, is amended to 7 read as follows:

8 Sec. 2059.201. ELIGIBLE PARTICIPATING ENTITIES. A state 9 agency or an entity listed in Sections <u>2059.058(b)(3)-(6)</u> 10 [<u>2059.058(b)(3)-(5)</u>] is eligible to participate in cybersecurity 11 support and network security provided by a regional network 12 security center under this subchapter.

SECTION 6. Section 11.175(g), Education Code, as added by Chapter 1045 (S.B. 1267), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, is repealed.

16 SECTION 7. Not later than March 31, 2024, the Texas 17 Education Agency and the Department of Information Resources shall 18 adopt rules necessary to implement the changes in law made by this 19 Act.

20 SECTION 8. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails 21 over another Act of the 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 2023, 22 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted 23 codes.

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SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
