1	AN ACT
2	relating to establishing a grant program for junior reserve officer
3	training programs to provide military funeral honors for veterans.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 434, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 434.0073 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 434.0073. GRANT PROGRAM FOR VETERAN FUNERAL SERVICES
8	IN CIVILIAN CEMETERY. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "JROTC program" means a junior reserve officer
10	training corps program for students in grades 6 through 12
11	established under 10 U.S.C. Section 2031.
12	(2) "Military funeral honors" means the services
13	described by 10 U.S.C. Sections 1491(b) and (c).
14	(3) "ROTC program" means a reserve officer training
15	corps program established under 10 U.S.C. Section 2101.
16	(4) "Veteran" means a person who has served in:
17	(A) the army, navy, air force, coast guard, or
18	marine corps of the United States; or
19	(B) the Texas national guard as defined by
20	<u>Section 437.001.</u>
21	(b) The commission shall establish a grant program for JROTO
22	programs to provide military funeral honors at funeral services for
23	veterans being buried in a cemetery other than a national military

cemetery or other military cemetery in this state.

- 1 (c) A JROTC program may receive training on the requirements and performance of military funeral honors at funerals of veterans 2 from a local organization that has the necessary training to 3 perform military funeral honors, including: 4 5 (1) an ROTC program; 6 (2) a military honor guard; 7 (3) a Veterans of Foreign Wars post; 8 (4) a law enforcement agency; (5) a fire department; or 9
- 10 (6) another nonprofit organization that is composed of or serves veterans and is qualified to provide training on the 11 12 requirements and performance of military funeral honors.
- (d) To be eligible for a grant under this section, a JROTC 13 14 program must submit an application on the form prescribed by the 15 commission. The commission shall make the application form available on the commission's publicly available Internet website. 16 17 An application for a grant under this section must include:
- (1) the name of the local organization that trained 18 19 the JROTC program in the performance of military honors at veteran funerals or, if the JROTC program was not able to obtain training 20 21 from a local organization, the names of the organizations the JROTC 22 program contacted to obtain training; and
- 23 (2) a detailed plan for how the JROTC program will 24 spend grant money awarded under this section, including, if the program intends to purchase air rifles, details on whether the 25 26 JROTC program is authorized to make the purchase and a plan for the 27 safe use and storage of the air rifles.

1 (e) A JROTC program awarded a grant under this section shall work with local organizations in the community to spread awareness 2 among veterans and the families of veterans of the program's 3 availability to perform military funeral honors in the community. 4 5 (f) Grant money awarded under this section may be used for: 6 (1) uniforms; 7 (2) air rifles, if: (A) the purchase and use of air rifles is 8 approved by the school district in which the JROTC program is 9 10 located; and (B) the JROTC program includes in the grant 11 12 application a safe storage and use plan that is approved by the 13 school district; 14 (3) American flags in a size approved for the purpose 15 of providing military honors, if one has not been provided to a veteran's family free of charge; 16 17 (4) <u>bugles;</u> (5) audio recordings of and equipment to play TAPS; or 18 19 (6) tuition and fees for a JROTC program instructor to enroll in a training course offered by an honor guard academy, if 20 the program is unable to receive training from a local 21 22 organization. 23 (g) A grant awarded under this section may not exceed 24 \$3,500. (h) The commission and the Veterans' Land Board may 25 26 publicize a JROTC program that received a grant under this section

as a resource to perform military funeral honors at the funeral of a

- 1 veteran in the community in which the JROTC program is located and
- 2 the JROTC program shall make its best effort to perform military
- 3 <u>funeral honors when requested.</u>
- 4 (i) The commission may accept gifts, grants, and donations
- 5 from any source to administer the grant program established under
- 6 this section.
- 7 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 8 of this Act, the commission shall adopt rules to implement the grant
- 9 program established under Section 434.0073, Government Code, as
- 10 added by this Act.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
