(c) The chair of the committee may share information 22 23 provided to the chair under Subsection (b) related to a physical attack or a threat of a physical attack on a critical facility with 24

10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
