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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT relating to public school accountability, including assessment of 2 academic skills, performance standards and sanctions, and public 3 high school graduation requirements. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 39.053, Education Code, is amended by 7 amending subsection (c) to read as follows: (c) School districts and campuses must be evaluated based on 8 three domains of indicators of achievement adopted under this 9 section that include: 10 11 (1)in the student achievement domain, indicators of 12 student achievement that must include: 13 (A) for evaluating the performance of districts 14 and campuses generally: an indicator that accounts for 15 (i) the 16 results of assessment instruments required under Sections 39.023(a), (c), and (l), as applicable for the district and campus, 17 including the results of assessment instruments required for 18 graduation retaken by a student, aggregated across grade levels by 19 subject area, including: 20 21 (a) for the performance standard 22 determined by the commissioner under Section 39.0241(a), the 23 percentage of students who performed satisfactorily on the assessment instruments, aggregated across grade levels by subject 24

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1 area; and 2 (b) for college the readiness 3 performance standard as determined under Section 39.0241, the percentage of students who performed satisfactorily on the 4 5 assessment instruments, aggregated across grade levels by subject 6 area; and (ii) an indicator that accounts for the 7 8 results of assessment instruments required under Section 39.023(b), as applicable for the district and campus, including the 9 10 percentage of students who performed satisfactorily on the assessment instruments, as determined by the performance standard 11 12 adopted by the agency, aggregated across grade levels by subject 13 area; and 14 (iii) an indicator that accounts for the 15 number of students who participate in and successfully complete courses in the enrichment curriculum under Section 28.002(a)(2); 16 17 and of 18 (A-1) for evaluating the performance elementary and middle school campuses, ind<u>icators that account for:</u> 19 (i) students in grades six, seven, and 20 eight who successfully complete and receive credit for a course 21 designated for a grade higher than the grade in which the student is 22 enrolled; and 23 24 (ii) students in grades six, seven, and eight, who successfully complete a career and technology course 25 26 under Section 48.106; and 27 for evaluating the performance of high school (B)

No. 4967 1 campuses and districts that include high school campuses, indicators that account for: 2 3 (i) students who satisfy the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) college readiness benchmarks prescribed by the 4 5 Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board under Section 51.334 on an assessment instrument in reading or mathematics designated by 6 the coordinating board under that section; 7 8 (ii) students who satisfy relevant performance standards on advanced placement tests or similar 9 10 assessments; (iii) students who earn dual course credits 11 12 in the dual credit courses; students who enlist in the 13 (iv) armed 14 forces of the United States or the Texas National Guard; 15 (v) students who industry earn 16 certifications; 17 (vi) students admitted into postsecondary industry certification programs that require as a prerequisite for 18 19 entrance successful performance at the secondary level; (vii) students whose successful completion 20 21 of a course or courses under Section 28.014 indicates the student's preparation to enroll and succeed, without remediation, in an 22 23 entry-level general education course for a baccalaureate degree or 24 associate degree; 25 (viii) students who successfully met 26 standards on a composite of indicators that through research indicates the student's preparation to enroll and succeed, without 27

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or campuses; and (3) in the closing the gaps domain: $[\tau]$ (A) the use of disaggregated data to demonstrate the differentials among students from different racial and ethnic groups, socioeconomic backgrounds, and other factors, including: (i) [(A)] students formerly receiving special education services; (ii) [(B)] students continuously enrolled; and (iii) [(C)] students who are mobile; and [-] (B) in evaluating the performance of elementary and middle school campuses, the commissioner shall use indicators as defined in Subsection (c)(1)(A)(iii)-(vi) and (A-1), for the School Quality component. SECTION 2. This act applies beginning with the 2023-2024 school year. SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
