A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a parent-directed supplemental services and
3	instructional materials program for public school students;
4	establishing an allotment under the Foundation School Program;
5	authorizing a fee.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Chapter 29, Education Code, is amended by adding
8	Subchapter R to read as follows:
9	SUBCHAPTER R. PARENT-DIRECTED SUPPLEMENTAL SERVICES PROGRAM
10	Sec. 29.751. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
11	(1) "Parent" has the meaning assigned by Section
12	<u>29.041.</u>
13	(2) "Supplemental instructional materials" includes
14	textbooks, computer hardware or software, other technological
15	devices, and other materials suitable for addressing an educational
16	need of a public school student.
17	(3) "Supplemental services" means an additive service
18	that provides an educational benefit to a public school student
19	<pre>including:</pre>
20	(A) virtual, advanced, and trade-related
21	programs;
22	(B) extracurricular activities;
23	(C) private tutoring and other supplemental

24 private instruction or programs; and

- 1 (D) college credit.
- 2 Sec. 29.752. ESTABLISHMENT AND ADMINISTRATION OF PROGRAM.
- 3 (a) The agency by rule shall establish and administer a
- 4 parent-directed program for public school students through which a
- 5 parent may direct supplemental services and supplemental
- 6 instructional materials for the parent's student who meets the
- 7 eligibility requirements for participation in the program. From
- 8 funds appropriated, the agency shall provide each student approved
- 9 as provided under this subchapter a grant as provided by Section
- 10 48.305 to purchase supplemental services and supplemental
- 11 instructional materials.
- 12 (b) In administering the program, the agency shall maintain
- 13 a system of online accounts to provide access to the grant described
- 14 by Subsection (a) to an eligible student's parent.
- 15 <u>(c) The agency shall designate one or more regional</u>
- 16 education service centers to administer the program under this
- 17 <u>section</u>.
- 18 (d) The agency shall establish a process for transfer of
- 19 direction of the account from the parent to the student, if
- 20 initiated by the student, for unexpended amounts in the account at
- 21 the time of the student's graduation that may be used in accordance
- 22 with Section 29.756(d).
- Sec. 29.753. APPLICATION FOR GRANT ON BEHALF OF STUDENT.
- 24 The agency shall establish an application process for an eligible
- 25 student's parent to apply for a grant held in an online account
- 26 maintained under Section 29.752(b) and assigned to the student
- 27 under Section 29.755.

- 1 Sec. 29.754. PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA. (a) The agency
- 2 shall establish eligibility criteria for the approval of an
- 3 application submitted under Section 29.753. The criteria must
- 4 require that the student be enrolled in the current school year at a
- 5 school district or open-enrollment charter school.
- 6 (b) The eligibility criteria established under this section
- 7 <u>must also prioritize students for whom a school district or</u>
- 8 open-enrollment charter school is eligible for a compensatory
- 9 education allotment under Section 48.104.
- 10 Sec. 29.755. APPROVAL OF APPLICATION; ASSIGNMENT OF
- 11 ACCOUNT. The agency shall approve each student who meets the
- 12 program eligibility criteria established under Section 29.754 and
- 13 <u>assign to the student an account maintained under Section</u>
- 14 29.752(b). The account may only be used by the student's parent to
- 15 purchase supplemental services or supplemental instructional
- 16 materials for the student, subject to Sections 29.756 and 29.757.
- 17 Sec. 29.756. ACCOUNT USE RESTRICTION. (a) Money in an
- 18 account assigned to a student under Section 29.755 may be used only
- 19 for supplemental services, supplemental instructional materials,
- 20 and expenditures for tuition and fees as authorized by Subsection
- 21 <u>(d)</u>.
- (b) Supplemental services must be provided by an
- 23 agency-approved provider.
- 24 (c) If the agency has approved vendors for a category of
- 25 supplemental instructional materials under Section 29.757,
- 26 supplemental instructional materials must be purchased from an
- 27 agency-approved vendor for that category of supplemental

- 1 instructional materials. If the agency does not establish criteria
- 2 for agency approval for a category of supplemental instructional
- 3 materials, money in the student's account may be used to purchase
- 4 the supplemental instructional materials from any vendor.
- 5 (d) In developing the program, the commissioner shall allow
- 6 the use of funds under the program to be spent on tuition and fees at
- 7 an institution of higher education or private or independent
- 8 institution of higher education including any unexpended funds in a
- 9 student's account at the time of graduation by the student for up to
- 10 six years following the year the student graduates.
- 11 Sec. 29.757. AGENCY-APPROVED PROVIDERS AND VENDORS:
- 12 CRITERIA AND APPLICATION. (a) The agency shall establish criteria
- 13 necessary for agency approval for each category of provider of a
- 14 professional service that is a supplemental service, as identified
- 15 by the agency.
- 16 (b) The criteria established under this section must
- 17 require a provider of a category of professional service to be
- 18 appropriately licensed or accredited in this state to provide that
- 19 service.
- 20 (c) The agency shall provide a procedure for providers of
- 21 supplemental services to apply to the agency to become an
- 22 <u>agency-approved provider.</u>
- 23 (d) The agency may establish criteria for agency approval of
- 24 vendors for each category of supplemental instructional materials
- 25 identified by the agency.
- 26 (e) If the agency establishes criteria for agency approval
- 27 for a vendor of a category of supplemental instructional materials,

- 1 the agency shall provide a procedure for vendors of that category to
- 2 apply to the agency to become an agency-approved vendor.
- 3 Sec. 29.758. PUBLIC SCHOOL PROVIDERS. A school district or
- 4 open-enrollment charter school provider approved under Section
- 5 29.757 may charge a fee for supplemental instructional materials or
- 6 supplemental services provided to a student under this subchapter
- 7 that otherwise would not have been provided to the student by the
- 8 <u>district or school.</u>
- 9 Sec. 29.759. ADMISSION, REVIEW, AND DISMISSAL COMMITTEE
- 10 DUTIES. (a) A student's admission, review, and dismissal
- 11 committee shall develop a student's individualized education
- 12 program under Section 29.005, in compliance with the Individuals
- 13 with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. Section 1400 et seq.),
- 14 without consideration of any supplemental services or supplemental
- 15 instructional materials that may be provided under the program
- 16 <u>under this subchapter.</u>
- 17 (b) Unless the district determines that an account has been
- 18 assigned to the student under Section 29.045, the admission,
- 19 review, and dismissal committee of a student approved for
- 20 participation in the program shall provide to the student's parent
- 21 at an admission, review, and dismissal committee meeting for the
- 22 student:
- (1) information regarding the types of supplemental
- 24 services or supplemental instructional materials available under
- 25 the program and provided by agency-approved providers for which an
- 26 account maintained under Section 29.752(b) for the student may be
- 27 used; and

- 1 (2) instructions regarding accessing an account
- 2 described by Subdivision (1).
- 3 Sec. 29.760. DETERMINATION OF COMMISSIONER FINAL.
- 4 Notwithstanding Section 7.057, a determination of the commissioner
- 5 under this subchapter and Section 48.305 is final and may not be
- 6 appealed.
- 7 Sec. 29.761. RULES. The commissioner shall adopt rules as
- 8 necessary to administer the supplemental services and
- 9 instructional materials program under this subchapter.
- 10 SECTION 2. Subchapter G, Chapter 48, Education Code, is
- 11 amended by adding Section 48.305 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 48.305. PARENT-DIRECTED SUPPLEMENTAL SERVICES FOR
- 13 STUDENTS GRANT. (a) A student to whom the agency awards a grant
- 14 under Subchapter R, Chapter 29, is entitled to receive a grant equal
- 15 to \$1,000 or a greater amount by appropriation.
- 16 (b) The agency shall use money appropriated to the agency
- 17 for purposes of this section to award grants under Subchapter R,
- 18 Chapter 29.
- (c) A student may receive a grant under Subchapter R,
- 20 Chapter 29, once while enrolled in kindergarten through grade
- 21 twelve. A student may receive an additional grant if the
- 22 legislature appropriates money for the additional grant in the
- 23 General Appropriations Act.
- SECTION 3. Not later than December 1, 2023, the
- 25 commissioner of education shall adopt all rules necessary for the
- 26 establishment and administration of the parent-directed
- 27 supplemental services program required under Subchapter R, Chapter

- 1 29, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 2 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
